PROGRAM FOR TEEN-AGE YOUTH TO BE INITIATED

In response to the increased needs of our Synagogue membership, plans are being made for the inauguration of youth clubs for teen-agers. Long range plans are in the making for the development of an active youth activities program in our center. The first step will be the formation of clubs for boys and girls between the ages of 13 and 18.

SUNDAY CLASS FOR 6 AND 7 YEAR OLDS TO BEGIN

Under the auspices of the Religious School, a special class for 6 and 7 year olds will begin meeting on Sunday, November 1st, it was announced by Theodore Comet, Principal of the School. The class, which will be open to both boys and girls, will meet throughout the year on Sunday mornings from 10:30 to 12:30, and will be under the guidance of a highly trained and well qualified teacher.

The content of this special class will be an introduction to the Religious School program and will include story-telling, arts and crafts, singing, dancing, and games. The purpose will be to provide the child with a two hour period of fun in which he will receive a Jewish experience that will be meaningful and geared to his level.

Parents interested in registering their children for this special class are urged to contact the Synagogue office today. Prompt attention to this matter will mean getting your youngster off to a good start. So please do not delay.

The number of clubs to be formed will depend on the response to this project. Those with children, relatives, or neighbors in this age bracket are urged to fill out and return the form on the bottom of page four.

These clubs will be under the guidance of able group workers and will meet as a club unit once a week. They will be democratically run and the youths themselves will determine the specific program and activities.

The overall program will cover the three main areas of Social, Athletic, and Cultural activity. These will be conducted both within the framework of the Club meeting as well as in special events such as dances, athletic tournaments, trips, etc.

The importance of teen-agers' participation in this kind of program cannot be overemphasized. For the teenager there is the fun of getting together with friends and the democratic experience of planning and working with others.
