# GALA YOUTH SABBATH WILL BE CELEBRATED IN SYNAGOGUE Home Coming Collegiates Special Guests

The college men and women of Kehilath Jeshurun who are home for the winter vacation will be the guests at a special service that will be held in our synagogue this Saturday morning.

The young men will receive Torah honors to the extent that the weekly portion will permit. The young ladies will be remembered with floral corsages in honor of the occasion. A special buffet kiddush will be served in the Social Hall at the close of services with the Men's Club and Sisterhood acting as hosts.

# Young People to Officiate -

Haskel Lookstein, a rabbinic student at Yeshiva College, will act as Cantor for the Musaf Service. Franklin Holzer, a Junior at Ramaz High School will chant the Shacharith Service. The weekly portion of the Torah will be read by the following: George Gruen and Ari Icikovic, both Juniors at Columbia College; and Morton Schatzman, a Senior at Ramaz.

Those who have seen these young men grow up in our midst and who have on occasion heard them read, especially the Purim Megillah, know that they may expect an expert and intelligent rendition of the Scriptural portion.

## Panel Discussion After Services -

At the close of services in the Main Synagogue, the congregation will proceed to the Auditorium of the Synagogue House to listen to a panel of three collegiates who will speak on the subject: "A Jew at College — Problems and Opportunities." Frederick Zuckerman, a medical student at the College of Physicians and Surgeons, Frances Holzer, a Senior at Oberlin College who has but recently been informed of her admission to the Long Island University Medical School, and Ida Westerman, a Senior at Hunter College who is preparing for a teaching career will be the panelists.

These three young people were brought up in Kehilath Jeshurun from their earliest childhood. They have made their mark at college and have won scholastic honors. It would prove enlightening to hear their impressions gained through experience as to what a young Jew or Jewess may encounter on an American college campus.

## Congregation Urged to Attend -

This is an unusual Sabbath. Parents plan all forms of recreation and entertainment for their children returning from school. Why not also provide religious recreation, so necessary for young people who are away from home a good part of the year.
