This year we are anticipating that a larger number than usual will be interested in attending the Congregational Seder since Passover occurs on a week-end. Since there will undoubtedly be many more requests than we can accommodate, we will follow the policy of accepting reservations in the order that they are received.

The subscription is \$11.00 per cover for each night. All reservations must be accompanied by check and must reach us no later than Wednesday, April 7th.
