The class will meet this week at 7:00 and continues under the leadership of our rabbinic assistant, Rabbi Joseph Feder. Those who have attended the previous sessions have greatly enjoyed them and we extend a cordial invitation to all our members and friends to join us this Saturday. edition. On the basis of past experience, we should like to make two observations. Particularly is this so when the Books are distributed during Yizkor and the Memorial Prayer is recited with a special prayer for those whose names are recorded.

The names which appear must be submitted to the office on an Authorization Form. NO NAME IS RECORD-ED ON THE STRENGTH OF A PREVI-OUS LISTING.

The second point we want to make is that the deadline of May 26th must be adhered to. This is the only way we can have the Book ready for the holiday of Shevuoth.

We urge all those who have not done so to attend to this immediately. An Authorization Form is printed on page 3 of this Bulletin. Fill it out and mail it to us before you overlook it. The Book of Remembrance is consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. Fulfill the pledge by submitting names for the Book of Remembrance.
