JUNIOR CONGREGATION TO HOLD FINAL SERVICE SATURDAY

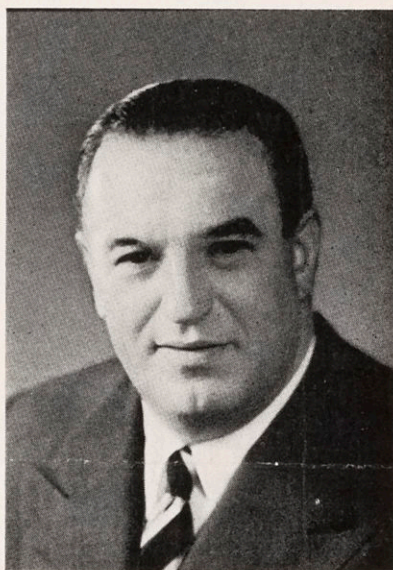
The final service of the Junior Congregation will be held this Saturday, May 29th, at the usual time of 10:30 in the Chapel.

With regard to this announcement we would like to comment briefly on what we consider an activity of vital and long-lasting importance to the young boys and girls who took advantage of it during the last thirty odd weeks. After the last High Holiday season, every Sabbath morning—week in and week out, rain or shine—found thirty to forty youngsters in the Chapel, conducting a service by themselves and for themselves. Proper supervision was provided in the person of Mr. Manfred Rechtschaffen who was regarded by the children as their friend and guide, who explained the why's and wherefore's of synagogue procedures and discussed with them the different features that constitute a Sabbath service.

A Memorial Day Sermon
