The Festival of Shevuoth was celebrated in Kehilath Jeshurun in a manner that was spiritually inspiring and in surroundings that were aesthetically beautiful. The Main Synagogue was decorated with an exceptionally lovely floral and leaf display to represent that part of the holiday which is known as Chag Habikkurim, the Festival of the First Fruits.

The services both days of Shevuoth were conducted in the dignified and moving way that is the tradition in our Synagogue and both services were remarkably well attended. We were especially pleased with the second day of Shevuoth. On that day it had all too often become the unfortunate custom for many to arrive only for the Yizkor prayers and then depart upon their conclusion. We regard Yizkor as part of the total service and therefore we were very pleased with the large number that came for the beginning of the morning service and staved until the end.

The Book of Remembrance, in which are recorded the names of those in whose memory a Yizkor offering was made, was made available to our worshippers at this Memorial service.
