The Simchat Torah holiday has taken on special significance for the children. Flags and boxes of candy will be distributed as usual to all the children. At the head of the Torah processions will be Junior Marshalls selected from among the pupils of Ramaz School and our Afternoon Religious School.

We would like all children to attend, however, we would like to make the following requests. Children below the age of four should not be brought to the Synagogue for the simple reason that they are too young to be expected to participate in the services. Experience has taught us that tots of that tender age hinder the progress of the service and make it difficult for the adults to take part in the proceedings as they would like to.

Our second request is that you should come on time. The children should be brought at 5:15 o'clock -- but not before 5:00, please -- to the Chapel.
