PRIMARY CLASS FOR SIX YEAR OLDS TO BEGIN

Continuing under the auspices of our afternoon Religious School, our special Primary Class for six year olds will begin meeting this Sunday, November 7th, it was announced by Mr. Theodore Comet, Principal of the school.

This class was introduced last year into our school and met with great success. It is open to both boys and girls and will meet on Sundays from 10:30 to 12:30.

The content of the class program is geared to prepare the child for our regular three-day-a-week afternoon school. The curriculum covers Bible stories, holidays, customs and ceremonies and outstanding Jewish personalities. The method of instruction is, of course, much more informal than that of the regular school, and emphasis is placed on story-telling, arts and crafts, singing, dancing, dramatics and games.

Those children who attended this class last were extremely pleased with the class. For them it was a period of complete enjoyment and at the same time they received a Jewish experience that was meaningful and important to them.

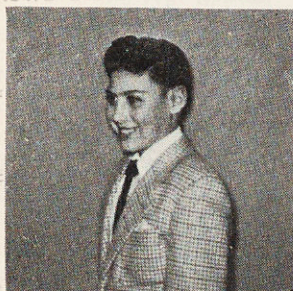
