Our guest speaker this year will be Dr. Henry Steele Commager, Professor of History at Columbia University. A choir, under the direction of Oscar Julius, will assist Cantor Konigsberg in officiating at the service which will be conducted by Rabbi Lookstein.

"THE JEW AND THE ARTS" THEME OF ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM

A three-pronged education program was announced this week by Martin Markson, Chairman of the Adult Education Committee. The three parts of the program are:

A special series of demonstration lectures on the theme, "The Jew and the Arts" to be held on certain specified Wednesdays beginning December 1st.

Weekly classes to meet Wednesday evenings from 8:00-9:00 P.M. starting December 1st.

A Sabbath seminar led by the members to discuss the portion of the week between Mincha and Ma'ariv (further information concerning this activity will be found above.

Lectures on "The Jew and the Arts"

The lecture series will cover the following topics: "The Jew and the Musical Arts"; "The Jew and the Dance";

"The Jew and the Fine Arts"; and "The Jew and the Literary Arts". The committee announced that the lecture series will be audio-visual, so that we can not only hear about these art forms, but actually see them in action.

The first lecture will take place on Wednesday, December 1st, at 9:00 P.M. on the topic "The Jew and the Musical Arts". This musical program will feature a lecture with demonstrations at the piano and vocally by Prof. A. W. Binder, famous Jewish American composer and lecturer, who will speak on Jewish music: past, present and future.

The second lecture will take place on December 15th, when Dvora Lapson, Dance Director of the Jewish Education Committee, will give a demonstration of Jewish Dance through the

Ages. After a short holiday recess the series will continue on January 5th, when Dr. Stephen Kayser, Curator of the Jewish museum, will provide an illustrated lecture on Jewish Art.

Jewish literature will be the theme of the last two sessions of this series. On January 12th, the world renowned author and critic, Maurice Samuels, will give Readings of Jewish Literature. On January 19th, Prof. Sol Liptzin, Chairman of the Department of Germanic and Slavic language at City College, will speak on The Golden Age of Yiddish Literature.

After the close of this Forum series, the Adult Education Program will continue with a series of four Sunday supper lectures to be given again by Rabbi Lookstein.

Weekly Classes -

The Adult Education program again offers courses each Wednesday evening, beginning December 1st, from 8:00-9:00 P.M. The subjects offered are: Talmud; Beginning Hebrew; Advanced Hebrew and American Jewish History. All these courses will be given by excellent instructors. The Talmud class is already in session.

We are offering this year a special course in music which will be given by our Cantor Jacob Konigsberg. This course will be a singing workshop. Members will learn a large repertoire of Jewish songs. Sabbath service melodies will be taught to increase participation in congregational singing. "By taking this course" announced the Committee, "congregants will be better able to learn the new music they will hear in the Synagogue and they will have the opportunity to participate with greater intelligence and feeling in the Synagogue's Services.

Liturgical Procedures Class Saturday Afternoon —

A class in liturgical procedures will be offered on Saturday afternoons one half-hour before Mincha. This class will begin on Saturday, December 4th. This course will aim at developing a reading fluency in the prayer book and the capacity to follow the prayers at Religious Services. It will also provide the training necessary to officiate at services and to learn the cantillations for the weekly portion and prophetic reading.

The discussion will be opened with a talk by our guest speaker, Prof. Charles Angoff, professor at N.Y.U., who is a prominent editor, author and lecturer. He was H. L. Menken's closest associate on the old American Mercury and was an editor of several other magazines including the Nation and the North American Review. He has written or edited a dozen books on literary history, music, world affairs

and literary criticism.

In the Jewish field, Prof. Angoff, is one of our most effective and color ful writers of Jewish short stories and novels. His major published works in Jewish fiction are: "When I Was a Boy in Boston", "Journey to the Dawn", and "In the Morning Light". The last two are novels that make up the first half of a projected tetralogy of Jewish-American life.

Prof. Angoff's creative talent, his wide experience in the American-Jewish field and his warm personality portend a very pleasant and stimulating evening.
