A Wholesome Attitude to a Melancholy Theme

Prof. A. W. Binder will be the feature attraction in a demonstration-lecture on "The Jew and the Musical Arts" at the opening session of the C.K.J. Adult Education Institute on Wednesday, December 1, 1954 at the Synagogue Social Hall at 9:00 P.M.

This lecture will open the series of Wednesday evening programs centering around the over-all theme of "The Jew and the Arts". Four other sessions on Jewish Arts are planned and will cover the dance, fine arts, and literature.

The CKJ Adult Education Committee, which has planned and organized this and other recently announced

programs, stated that "We are fortunate, indeed, to have Prof. Binder as our series-starter, for his has been a powerful and vigorous voice in Jewish Arts for over the past 35 years."

Prof. Binder's lecture and demonstrations will survey the history of Jewish Music and will include an evaluation of its present and future position. The demonstrations to be offered by Prof. Binder at the piano and vocally will cover Jewish Liturgical Music and the Jewish Folksong (Continued on Page 3)


ISRAEL CUMMINGS HONORED

through the ages. Arabic, Sephardic, Ashkenazic, modern Israeli as well as the ancient traditions will be covered.

A more than 35-year career as composer, conductor, and teacher is the rich storehouse upon which Prof. Binder's demonstration-talk will be based. "His background," said the Committee, "goes deep into the synagogual and musical strains of the Jewish People. He is of a long line of cantors and musicians. His liturgical music is sung in synagogues the world over.

Prof. Binder's Works -

His compositions have been performed by leading orchestras in this country and abroad, including the Detroit Symphony, the Columbus Symphony, and the Israeli Symphony. He has performed at Town Hall, Carnegie Hall, and in other concert halls. He has appeared on radio networks in this country as well as in concert halls and over Kol Israel Broadcasting System in Israel. His "Sabbath in Song" and "Jewish Holidays in Song" have been recorded by RCA Victor. His Palestinian Folksongs and other music have also been recorded.

After the demonstration-talk, there will be a question-and-answer period and round table discussion for all. The session will close with light refreshments.

Weekly Classes -

Also beginning on December 1st, from 8:00 — 9:00 p.m. are most of the Wednesday evening courses offered by the Adult Institute. The subjects to be given are Beginning Hebrew, Advanced Hebrew and American Jewish History. The Talmud class, which has already begun meeting, is under the direction of our assistant rabbi, Sol Roth.

A new innovation this year is a special course in music to be given by our Cantor Jacob Konigsberg.

Liturgical Procedures Class -

Our popular course in liturgical procedures will begin on Saturday, December 4th and will be held one-half hour before Mincha. This course will be directed by Haskel Lookstein. It is geared to develop greater fluency and to provide the training necessary to officiate at services and to chant the Haftorah. Haskel Lookstein, who is studying for the rabbinate at Yeshiva, is instructor in Liturgical Procedures at Ramaz School.
