After Z'miros the program was turned over to Rabbi Sol Roth, who acted as moderator. The two discussion leaders this week were Mr. Ira F. Weisman and Mr. Moses Schonfeld.

Mr. Weisman selected as his theme the incident in this week's Bible portion, where Abraham purchased land for a burial place. Calling this the first business transaction described in the Bible he applied it to our present day issues of ownership of property, capitalism and democracy. Mr. Schonfeld chose the theme of love and marriage basing it on the Biblical narrative describing how a wife was selected for the patriarch Isaac.

At the conclusion of the discussion the group returned to the Chapel, where the Seminar was brought to a conclusion with the Ma'ariv and Havdalah service.

Last Saturday was only the beginning. However, the turnout, the speakers and the warm mood made it an excellent beginning. We look forward to the Seminar becoming a very important and highly rewarding activity on our Kehilath Jeshurun agenda.

Another item by the Rabbi of unusual interest is his article "Religious

Procedures at Kehilath Jeshurun", in which he describes those religious procedures which over the years have evolved into an official pattern of worship in our Synagogue. This record follows in the tradition of the "Pinkas" which were records of religious procedures kept by many Jewish Communities on the European continent.

Pictorial Album Features "Art of Israel" —

As in the past, our pictorial album was divided into two sections. The first consisted of "shots" taken during special occasions. It showed in visual terms some of the many activities that take place during the year at our synagogue.

The second section is usually devoted to some area of Jewish culture. This year it features an "Art of Israel" folio which consists of reproductions of fourteen painting masterpieces from Israel. The reproductions are magnificent and a source of deep pleasure to all who behold them. Many of the

In this section, there appear brief interpretations of the holidays as well as a "history" of the Jewish calendar and how it differs from the general calendar. Then, too, on a page devoted to each month, are listed the Yahrzeits of deceased parents of our members for that particular month. The calendar pages continue until Rosh Hashanah of 1955.

An innovation this year that was very favorably received was the listing of donors in a way that was more in keeping with the dignity of the Year Book.

In all, the 1954 Year Book represents another link in the long chain of synagogue projects of which we may well be proud. From the literary and artistic standpoints, it leaves little to be desired.

Mr. Theodore Comet was the editor of the 1954 Year Book and he was ably assisted by Miss Shirley Levittan.

Educational Scholarship Fund Benefitted by Year Book —
