CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED FOR 1955 YEARBOOK

We are trying to reach our collegiates in advance in order to inform them of the welcome planned for them. Unfortunately, we do not have the names of all the young men and young women of our congregation who are at college, either in the city or out-of-town. We would, therefore, greatly appreciate it if parents would call the Synagogue Office without delay and give us the names of their sons and daughters at college in order that we may contact them directly.

Max J. Etra, President of the Congregation, announced this week the launching of our 1955 Year Book Campaign.

Over the years, our Year Book has set an example of what a congregational Year Book should be like. It has done this in two ways. The first by publishing a book of unusual beauty, which is not only a record of our Synagogue year, but also a source of important information and cultural inspiration.

In the second place, all the proceeds from the Year Book go exclusively to the Educational Scholarship Fund. Not one penny of the income derived goes to the Congregation itself. The Educational Scholarship Fund has been set up to provide education scholarships for deserving children to those institutions and causes that are the sole beneficiary of this fund: Ramaz School, The Afternoon Religious School, Summer Camp Fund and the College Scholarship Fund.

The Year Book campaign is, therefore, certainly a worthy one that merits the support of all. The children who are assisted by us come from all over metropolitan New York and so, the obligation is not strictly a local one. The Year Book campaign is one activity in which everyone can participate. It just means a little effort in soliciting ads.

In a short while you will be contacted for your assistance. We urge that you give it your attention promptly and wholeheartedly, for in this way you can insure the success of this year's campaign.

DVORA LAPSON TO GIVE DANCE-LECTURE ON "THE JEW AND THE DANCE"

The second lecture in our Forum series will be given by Miss Dvora Lapson on Wednesday evening, December 15th at 9 o'clock in the Synagogue Social Hall. Her topic will be "The Jew and the Dance". This second lecture is part of our Wednesday evening forum series which revolves about the overall theme, "The Jew and the Arts".

The Forum series opened last Wednesday evening with a demonstration lecture by Prof. A. W. Binder on "The Jew and the Musical Arts". In coming weeks, the topics "The Jew and the Fine Arts" and "The Jew and the Literary Arts" will be covered.

Miss Lapson's program will be devoted to a survey of the Jewish Dance through the Ages. She will emphasize the background and origin of various Jewish dances. Miss Lapson will illustrate her talk with a performance of dances typifying the different eras she

There is probably no other person in the United States more qualified to present this kind of program. Besides being a well known performer, both in this country and abroad, Miss Lapson is the Dance Director of the Jewish Education Committee of New York. She has taught in many colleges, universities and dance workshop groups, including the College of the Pacific. In addition, Miss Lapson has published two books on the dance: "New Palestinian Dances" and "Jewish Festival Dances".

The C.K.J. Adult Education Committee, in its announcment of the appearance of Miss Lapson, stated, "With Miss Dvora Lapson as our second demonstrator-lecturer we have the distinct honor of having an internationally noted pioneer of the Jewish Dance in our times, a distinguished dancer and a distinguished teacher. Her background in the Jewish Dance is authentic and of the Jewish people."

After the demonstration-lecture there will be a short period for questions and then the program will close with a light snack.

Henry Steele Commager Delivers Brilliant Address —

Our guest speaker, Prof. Henry Steele Commager, more than lived up to his advanced billing as one of our outstanding historians, educators, and liberals. He gave a brilliant talk on "The Pattern of American Freedom", in which he outlined those developments in our history that made America a strong and successful democracy.

These developments, Prof. Commager pointed out, were actually variations of old themes; institutions and patterns brought from Europe, but adapted to the ever-changing American scene. The major factors in the pattern of freedom are as follows. The separation of church and state without a resulting loss in ethical and moral conduct. The assumption of liberty without license. Mass education without the destruction of culture. An effective system of defense without the rise of a military caste.

Especially important was the development of a government that did not intrude into the private lives of its citizenry and that governed without the fear of the people. These patterns are what gave America its strength and we must be ever on the alert to guard them.
