# SISTERHOOD SYMPOSIUM FOR DECEMBER 20th ON "PLANNING YOUR CHILDREN'S CAREERS"

Mrs. Harry W. Baumgarten, Chairman of the Program Committee, announced that a special symposium will be held at the next Sisterhood Open Luncheon meeting on Monday, December 20th, at 12:30 P.M. The theme of the symposium will be "Helping your children make the most out of school—planning for your children's careers."

"We are very fortunate in the selection of the three members of our symposium panel," said Mrs. Baumgarten. "Each is an expert in the field." The three panelists are: Dr. Samuel Goodside, Supervisor of the Ramaz Lower School; Mr. William Karp, President of Vocational Consulting Associates; and Mr. Jack Yourman, Clinical Psychologist.

Dr. Goodside has endeared himself to us through the Ramaz School as an able and warm educator. Aside from his position as supervisor of the Ramaz Lower School, he is a lecturer at the Graduate School of Yeshiva University. He received his Ph.D from New York University and is a member of the Kappa Delta Pi Educational Honor Society. For twenty-five years, he has been a teacher and administrator on all levels of public school and Jewish education.

Our second panelist, Mr. Karp, is a pioneer and leader in vocational and

educational guidance. In twenty years, he has helped thousands of people with educational and career problems. He was Director of the Vocational Adjustment Program of the United Service for New Americans. After World War II, he helped shape the veteran's advisement and guidance program and was a consultant to the Air Force. Mr. Karp holds many elective and appointed offices with various social and educational projects.

Our third panelist, Mr. Yourman, is Director of the College Skills Center and is one of our top reading experts. He has supervised the teaching of hundreds of children with educational and emotional problems. He is the originator of the name "Speed Reading" and was among the first reading experts invited to give in-plant training to executives. At present, he gives courses in reading and study at Rutgers University and is a consultant to the Westchester Schools. Mr. Yourman is also on the staff of the Vocational Consulting Associates.

With the high calibre of our panelists, we can be certain that our symposium will be an outstanding program. We invite all our Sisterhood members, their friends, and interested parents to attend our meeting on December 20th. As usual a dessert luncheon will be served.
