## STEPHEN S. KAYSER TO SPEAK JANUARY 5 ON "THE JEW AND THE FINE ARTS"

Jewish accomplishments in the fine arts will be the subject matter of our next forum lecture by Dr. Stephen S. Kayser, Curator of the Jewish Museum, on Wednesday evening, January 5th, at 9 o'clock. This will be the third presentation in our Institute Forum series on "The Jew and the Arts".

As has been the pattern in our Forum series, Dr. Kayser, will not only lecture on his subject, but will provide vivid slide illustrations. "In Dr. Kayser," announced the Adult Education Committee, "we have the rare and unique opportunity of listening to a world renowned art critic, writer, historian, and religious teacher. From Czechoslovakia to Columbia University, to the University of California to the Jewish Museum, he has left an impressive trail and has contributed greatly to the growing public aware-

## SISTERHOOD SYMPOSIUM MERITS NEW YORK TIMES WRITE-UP

This past Monday afternoon, our Sisterhood conducted a symposium program so unusual that the N. Y. Times gave it a fine writeup in its December 21st issue. This program was attended by an unusually large representation of Sisterhood members and friends.

The theme of the symposium was "Helping your children in their Careers". The three panelists were Dr. Samuel Goodside, Supervisor of Ramaz Lower School, Mr. William Karp, President of Vocational Consulting Associates and Mr. Jack Yourman, Clinical Psychologist. Our panelists explained various types of problems due to school and non-school factors and emphasized the importance of recognizing signs of emotional difficulties. They discussed those difficulties which arose from severe emotional problems and others that can be fairly easily corrected by the learning of certain technical skills.

It was especially emphasized throughout that there was need for counseling the school child from the sixth grade up. The earlier this was started the less chance there was for difficulties later on. Following the talks there was a vigorous question and answer period in which these areas were further gone into.

This program was completely arranged by Mrs. Harry W. Baumgarten, Chairman of the Program Committee. This program was the kind of activity which is not easy to arrange and we would like to express our appreciation to Mrs. Baumgarten, not only for her efforts, but for their remarkable success.

nia, the University of California and the M. H. DeYoung Memorial Museum of San Francisco. Columbia University and the University of Brno in Czechoslovakia claimed Dr. Kayser as their own still earlier in his career.

The integrated series of demonstration-lectures, sponsored and organized by the CKJ Education Institute as an experiment in audio-visual education, began on December 1st with "The Jew and the Musical Arts" by Prof. A. W. Binder and was continued on December 15th with "The Jew and the Dance" by Miss Dvora Lapson. After Dr. Kayser's January 5th session there will be two more demonstration-lectures; both on "The Jew and the Literary Arts," and featuring Prof. Sol Liptzin and Mr. Maurice Samuel.
