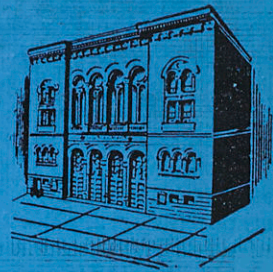

PROF. SOL LIPTZIN TO SPEAK JANUARY 19 ON "YIDDISH LITERATURE"

The concluding lecture in our Forum Series will be given on Wednesday evening, January 19th, by Prof. Sol Liptzin on "The Classics of Yiddish Literature". This lecture represents part 2 of the "Jew and the Literary Arts."

In announcing this lecture, the Adult Education Committee stated that we

are indeed fortunate to have as our concluding speaker a man who has such a wide experience in the Jewish and general Literary field. Prof. Liptzin is chairman of the Department of Germanic and Slavonic Languages at City College. He is a lecturer on Comparative and Yiddish Literature.

Dr. Liptzin was educated at City College, University of Berlin, and Columbia University. He received the degree of Ph.D. from Columbia in 1924. Since 1923 he has been on the faculty of City College. He has also served as Visiting Professor at the University of California, Northwestern University, and Yeshiva University. He has traveled widely and studied Jewish communities on various continents.

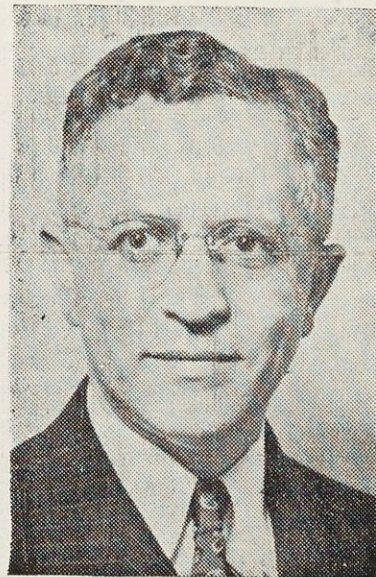
