RELIGIOUS SCHOOL TO ATTEND CHILDREN'S THEATRE

Theodore Comet, Principal, announced that the children of our Afternoon Religious School will continue the practice established last year and will hold their own theatre party on Sunday afternoon, March 13th, at 2:30 P.M. The play that will be seen is "Asher-Levy in New Amsterdam", a presentation of the Jewish Theatre for Children Department of the Jewish Education Committee.

This play was originally presented four years ago and is being brought back by popular request. It is especially appropriate in this Tercentenary year for its colorful and exciting recreation of the birth pangs of the first Jewish community in this country.

The central plot concerns itself with the story of Asher Levy, a Dutch Jew, who defied Peter Stuyvesant and led the first fight for freedom and equality in the new world. Although dealing with a serious theme, it is an exciting play for children to watch; it has Indians, dancers, songs and villains.

Kehilath Jeshurun has reserved a special section and an invitation is extended not only to the members of our Religious School, but to parents and friends as well. The cost is 75 cents per child and \$1.00 per adult. The play will be performed at the Joan of Arc Playhouse, 154 West 93rd Street.

We must know in advance how many will be attending. We ask that all those interested please make their reservations by February 15th.

Today, the State of Israel produces a large variety of sweet and dry wines, including Rishon (a sacramental grape wine), Tokay, Sauterne, Hock and Adom Atic (Burgundy). Israel's wines have been acclaimed throughout Europe, for many years. In recent months, a determined effort has been launched to introduce wines made in Israel in this country.

Our members are urged to support this effort, since the Israeli wines are not only superb products, but also because increased wine exports from Israel will help to strengthen the new State's economy. Israeli wines are strictly kosher.
