RELIGIOUS SCHOOL TO HOLD OPEN SCHOOL WEEK

Our afternoon Religious School will hold Open School Week from February 6th — 13th, it was announced by Theodore Comet, Principal. During this time, parents will be able to visit with the teachers, see the classes in action and attend a special assembly.

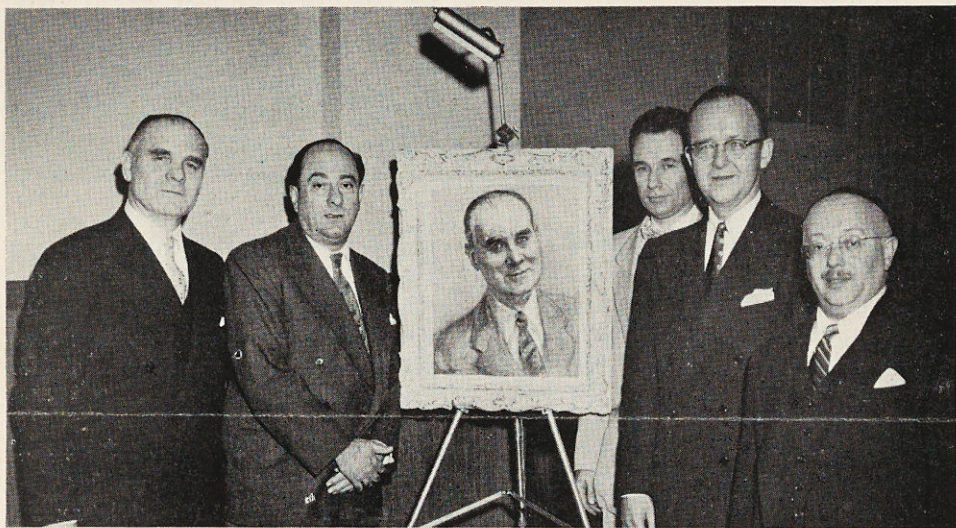
SUNDAY SUPPER LECTURE DATES

LARGE TURNOUT HONORS IRA F. WEISMAN AT MEN'S CLUB DINNER

"The good men do is oft interred within their bones," was the opinion of William Shakespeare, but the members of our Men's Club felt otherwise when they turned out en masse on Thursday evening, January 20th, to honor the good deeds of Ira F. Weisman, who was for 15 years President of our Men's Club.

Mr. Weisman, however, was not the only one honored on this occasion. The turnout, the spirit and the good fellowship evidenced that evening was a fine tribute to the Men's Club itself and the vitality of that organization in which Ira invested so much of his time and energies.

The evening began with cocktails in the auditorium, followed by an unusually delicious meal served by our Men's Club member, Arnold Weiss. Saul J. Lance acted as master of ceremonies and introduced the guests on the dais.

Max J. Etra, President of the Congregation, extended greetings and best wishes of Kehilath Jeshurun and pointed out that Mr. Weisman was active not only in the Men's Club, but in the Synagogue as well where he is a member of the Board of Trustees. Mrs. Hyman Abrams, Sisterhood President, greeted the guest of honor on the part of her organization and expressed the pleasure it had been to work with Mr. Weisman. Hyman I. Bucher, President of the Men's Club, briefly summarized the pioneering efforts made by Ira during the fifteen years of his presidency and spoke about some of the highlights of that period. Mr. Lance spoke of Ira's many efforts on behalf of the Ramaz School.

At this point on the program, we had a surprise guest, Sam Levenson, well known comedian and brother of our member, William Levenson. Sam Levenson came down not in a professional capacity, but to pay a personal honor to Mr. Weisman. Mr. Levenson was called upon to say a few words and provided a hilarious touch with his wonderful reminiscences

of our Synagogue, where he got his start, and of his family.

Rabbi Lookstein Caps Program —

The highlight of the evening was the tribute paid to the guest of honor by Rabbi Lookstein. In his warm and moving talk, our Rabbi described how Ira first made contact with the Synagogue and how little by little he became involved in the life of the Synagogue and climaxed his activity by becoming President of the Men's Club, reorganizing that institution and giving it a firm and imaginative leadership for fifteen years. The Rabbi compared the growth of the Men's Club with the growth of Ira F. Weisman, as an active participant in Jewish communal life.

Rabbi Lookstein concluded his talk and the evening's program by presenting to Mr. Weisman on the part of the Men's Club a portrait painted by David Immerman. At this point all present arose to give a standing ovation to our guest of honor who so richly merited the warm and heartfelt tribute that was paid him that night.
