METROPOLITAN MUSEUM EXHIBITS JEWISH CEREMONIAL OBJECTS

One hundred and fifty rare Jewish ceremonial objects for the Synagogue and home are now being shown in the exhibit "Art of the Hebrew Tradition" at the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

This exhibit commemorates the tercentenary of the first permanent Jewish community in America which was established in 1654 on Manhattan Island. This display will remain on view through Sunday, February 27th. The exhibit includes such objects used in the Synagogue as Torah ornaments, Ark curtains, Torah cases, mantles, headpieces, crowns breastplates. Also on display are obiects created for ceremonial use in the home. These include Sabbath lamps, spice containers, wine cups, Passover plates and Chanukah lamps. We are sure that this exhibit will be of interest to our readers.
