"IN SEARCH OF GOOD LIFE" THEME OF SUPPER LECTURE SERIES

This year, Kehilath Jeshurun continues for its 8th consecutive season its program of Sunday Supper Lectures. This series, established under the sponsorship of our Men's Club has become one of our most important activities. The lectures will again be given by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein and the general theme this year is "In Search of the Good Life", Ethical Teachings of Three Latter-Day Saints.

The subjects and dates of the individual lectures are (please note there has been a change in the date of the final lecture):

- 1. February 27th Rabbi Israel Salanter: "Man's Relation to Himself"
- 2. March 20th—The Chofetz Chaim: "Man's Relation to Man".
- 3. April 3rd Lubavitch: "Man's Relation to God"

Rabbi Lookstein selected this topic this year for he feels it is one which is of primary concern to every thinking person. The basic purpose of a house of worship, in fact of all religion, is to show people how to lead a good life. Judaism has often been defined as a way of life and by this is meant the very way in which we act with ourselves, our fellow men and with God.

The three rabbis selected represent very specific points of view that have made a great influence in Jewish thinking during the past century. Each of these men had built up a school of disciples and followers and their influence is felt to this very day. We are sure that the ethical insights these great men evolved from their life

experiences will be pertinent for us today.

The subscription is \$8.00 for the entire series of three lectures and \$3.00 for a single lecture. The lecture programs will begin with supper being served at 6:30 P.M.

Series Started in 1947 -

The Annual Supper Lecture Series was instituted in 1947, and was incorporated into the larger body of adult studies in the Kehilath Jeshurun Institute. In past years, the lectures were on: the history of the Zionist Movement; Reform, Conservative and Orthodox Judaism; Hassidism, Rationalism and Rabbinism; major books of the Bible; four classics of Judaism; Prophets of Jewish Survival; and, last year, Four Cardinal Principles of Judaism.

The lecture series reservation forms are being mailed this week. In this connection, may we call two important matters to your attention in advance: first, reservations, to be honored, must be accompanied by check. Second, the deadline date for reservations is Monday, February 21st.

We urge the entire congregational family to take advantage of these lectures. We extend a cordial invitation to the members of the Men's Club, the Sisterhood, the parents of Ramaz School as well as the residents of the neighborhood at large to avail themselves of this unique opportunity to spend an evening of delightful social and intellectual activity.
