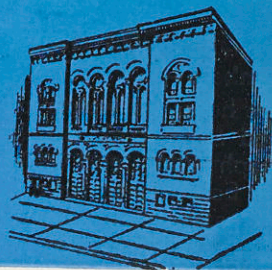

YOUTH TO CONDUCT PURIM SERVICE MONDAY EVENING, MARCH 7th

The festive holiday of Purim will be ushered in this year on Monday evening, March 7th, when another capacity congregation is expected to attend the Ma'ariv service which again will be turned over to the young men of our congregational family. The evening service as well as the reading of the Megillah will be entrusted to the capable hands of students from our Ramaz School.

The practice of having our own young men read the Purim Scroll has become one of the highly anticipated events of our Synagogue year. Introduced several years ago, it has received city-wide acclaim, and has been instrumental in bringing to our Synagogue larger congregations with every passing year.

Gershman will officiate as Cantor and the Megillah readers will be Saul Eisenbud, Samuel Eisenstadt, Martin Feinsod, Morton Julius, Martin Mayer, Bruce Shoulson, Jacques Van Amerongen, Robert Vigoda, David Weisberg and Joseph Weisenfeld. Again in charge of their preparations is Mr. Isaac B. Rapaport, an instructor at Ramaz.

Purim is a holiday that appeals to young and old alike and we urge all our members and friends to be sure to bring their children with them. The pupils of Ramaz School and of our afternoon Religious School will also be our guests and all the children will be given noise-makers to accompany the reading of the Megillah.

GROUP FOR TEEN-AGERS BEING PLANNED

We are now in the process of forming a special group for teen-agers. This group will include girls from 14-17 and boys from 15-18.

The first meeting of the teen-agers will take place on Sunday morning, March 6th, at 12:30 o'clock in the Synagogue Library. Letters of invitation have been sent out to the children of our congregational family. Obviously, we were able to send these letters only to those listed on our family records. We are sure there are many who are not on our list and we would like here to extend a cordial invitation to all those who fall within our teenage range to attend this first meeting and join the group.

The program of the teen-age club will be in general of a social and cultural nature. The specific activities, however, will be democratically decided upon by the members. This group is being formed under the direction of Theodore Comet and Rabbi Sol Roth.

HEBREW IN OUR PUBLIC SCHOOLS

For many years a drive has been on to introduce the teaching of Hebrew in our High Schools. This drive has been successful and new efforts are being made to bring Hebrew into the Junior High Schools as well.

In New York City, twenty-eight Junior High Schools already have Hebrew on their curriculum and efforts are being made to persuade additional schools to do the same. The best form of persuasion is of course, an interest on the part of students to take Hebrew. At this time, 7th year students in the public Junior High Schools are receiving language choice forms to select the language to be studied in the 8th grade in September, 1955. We would like to recommend that children in the 7th grade indicate Hebrew as their first choice. Students now begin language study in the 8th grade of Junior High School instead of in Senior High School.
