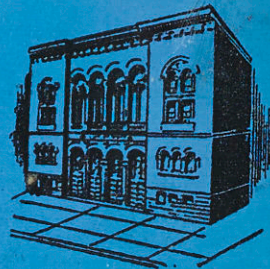

CONGREGATION PAYS TRIBUTE TO PANELISTS AT LAST SEUDAH-SEMINAR

Our Sabbath Seudah-Seminar, the most successful activity introduced in our Synagogue this year, was brought to a fine conclusion last Saturday afternoon with a program honoring all those who participated during the year as panelists. A large turnout of members and friends were on hand to pay tribute to the panelists and to enjoy the talks given by Rabbi Lookstein and Rabbi Roth.

After Mincha services in the Chapel, refreshments and Z'Miros were enjoyed in the Social Hall. Rabbi Roth presented an evaluation of the Seudah-Seminar. He described the reactions of those he asked to be panelists and how unusually well the assignments had been carried out. Rabbi Roth said that in his experience the talks presented by the panelists were on a higher level than any he had heard presented by a lay group.

Martin Markson, Chairman of the Adult Education Committee, which sponsors the Seudah-Seminar, extended greetings on behalf of his committee and presented each panelist with an inscribed copy of "The Five Megilloth", one of the Biblical books in the Soncino series. A Look Ahead

CONTROVERSIAL ISSUE DISCUSSED AT SISTERHOOD OPEN MEETING

One of the most controversial and misunderstood issues of our day received a good deal of clarification last Monday afternoon at the Sisterhood Open Luncheon Meeting, when Shirley R. Levittan discussed "The Fifth Amendment, What is it doing and what is it undoing?"

Eschewing the congressional investigations and the Communist issue, Miss Levittan concentrated on the amendment itself and defined just what its purpose is and what it was historically intended to accomplish. She traced the development of the Fifth Amendment from its beginning as a reaction to the inquisitorial methods used in the Star Chamber trials in England. (The name Star, Miss Levittan pointed out, is derived from the Hebrew word, Shtar, which means contract, since the first Star Chamber was set up in a room where Jewish financiers kept their documents.)

In some democratic societies like France, the judicial system does not provide the citizen with the privilege of the Fifth Amendment and there are many serious students of the law who feel it should be abolished here. In

Miss Levittan's opinion the amendment is an important contribution to the protection of the individual in our constant search to maintain a balance between what is needed to protect society and what is needed to protect the individual.

Although it is a topic not easy to deal with, Miss Levittan provided an unusually clear presentation of the meaning of the Fifth Amendment and of the issues involved in its application to our daily lives. After her talk, a spirited question and answer period followed.

Mrs. Harry W. Baumgarten, Program Chairman, made the arrangements for this meeting.

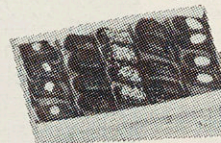

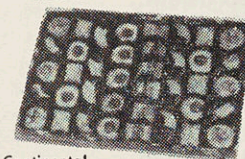
