\$29,000 RAISED FOR YESHIVA UNIVERSITY AT SPECIAL TESTIMONIAL SABBATH

An unusually large congregation attended services in our Synagogue last Saturday in order to pay tribute to the guests of honor, Max J. Etra, A. Phillip Goldsmith, Benjamin Gottesman and Samuel Rosen. Many congregants as well as worshippers from the community at large came especially as a mark of appreciation for the valiant services these four distinguished congregants are rendering to Yeshiva University as members of its Board of Trustees.

The Sabbath was an excellent reflection of the close ties between our Congregation and Yeshiva University. The guests of honor too deserved the tribute they received. Mr. Max J. Etra,

President of our Congregation, was elected last year as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Yeshiva University and he has travelled extensively throughout the country on behalf of the Yeshiva. Mr. A. Phillip Goldsmith, Vice-President of the Congregation, was elected to the Yeshiva Board only this year, but has already manifested a keen devotion to Yeshiva affairs. Mr. Benjamin Gottesman continues his father's allegiance to Yeshiva University and serves at present as Chairman of the institution's Endowment Fund. Mr. Samuel Rosen has had a long association with Yeshiva as a trustee and is now serving as Chairman of the Nominations Committee which selects trustees for the University.

During the service, Rabbi Lookstein, himself an honorary member of the Board of Trustees of Yeshiva University, expressed the feelings that the Congregation felt for the guests of honor and for Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of Yeshiva University. He had them escorted to places of honor on the front platform of the Synagogue.

SECOND SUNDAY SUPPER LECTURE ENJOYED BY FULL HOUSE Concluding Talk to be Given on Sunday, April 17th

Another fine turnout of members and friends filled the Social Hall last Sunday evening to hear Rabbi Lookstein give a talk on "The Chofetz Chaim: Man's Relation to Man". It was the second of the Sunday Supper Lecture Series on "In Search of the Good Life; Ethical Teachings of Three Latter Day Saints".

In a warmly received lecture, Rabbi Lookstein dealt with the life of the Chofetz Chaim, a man who during his own lifetime was regarded as a saint and legendary figure, and the unusual code of behaviour that he devised, preached and practiced. Although the Chofetz Chaim died only twenty-two years ago, the world he represents may seem to us very remote. Yet, Rabbi Lookstein brought it close to home by presenting the Chofetz Chaim's intense preoccupation with ethical conduct as a very important counterbalance to the opposing

Rabbi Lookstein presented the Chofetz Chaim so effectively that at the conclusion of his talk the audience felt that they had been for one and a half hours in the presence of a truly saintly personality who led a life that was outwardly serene yet was filled with an intense spiritual excitement and drama.

The third Supper Lecture, the concluding one in the series, will be given after the Passover holiday on Sunday evening, April 17th. The topic that will then be discussed is "Lubavitch: Man's Relation to God".


