Last week the Synagogue Office mailed our members and friends a printed card to be returned with the names of those who are to be included in the Book. A large response has already been received. But we want to remind you of one thing. No name is included in the Book of Remembrance on the strength of a previous listing. We must have your authorization before we proceed.

Every year there are always a few who neglect to tell us their wishes in this matter and then are disappointed to find no listing for their dear ones. Do not be among these few. Fill in the form which has been provided therefore and return it to the office today.

The Book of Remembrance, published annually at Shevuoth, provides an opportunity to our worshippers to

fulfill the solemn pledge made at Yizkor time with reverence and dignity. In keeping with the spirit of the occasion the offerings themselves were kept at the purely nominal level of no less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars for each listing. Thus the offerings represent purely a token of respect and love for the departed.

May 20th has been set as the deadline for the Book of Remembrance. We must adhere to this deadline for we want the book ready for the holiday of Shevuoth. We urge all those who have not sent in their authorization, to attend to it immediately.
