Annual Meeting Re-Elects:

MAX J. ETRA, President; A. PHILLIP GOLDSMITH, Vice-President; SAMUEL A. MARCUS, Treasurer and ROMIE SHAPIRO, Secretary New Members Inducted and Anniversarians Feted

At the 83rd Annual Membership Meeting, which was held Thursday evening, May 5th, the congregation voiced its faith in the Synagogue leadership by re-electing its officers for another term. Returned to office were: Max J. Etra, President, A. Phillip Goldsmith, Vice-President, Samuel A. Marcus, Treasurer and Romie Shapiro, Secretary.

This meeting which filled the auditorium of the Synagogue House, was considered by many to be the finest that they had participated in. For the newcomers, it was certainly a revelation — they never thought that an Annual Meeting could be so enjoyable and attract such a large turnout.

This 83rd Annual Meeting continued a time honored tradition in Kehilath Jeshurun, where annually the members of the Congregation come to hear reports of progress, to welcome the new members, to pay homage to those of our family who have passed away during the year and to cast their votes for the officers and trustees, who will administer the affairs of the Congregation for the coming year.

The proceedings Thursday evening began with the singing of the National Anthem led by Cantor Jacob Konigsberg. After the Invocation was pronounced by Rabbi Sol Roth, Max J. Etra, presiding for the 15th consecutive year, rendered his President's Annual report. Instead of limiting his report to a statement of activities of the past year, Mr. Etra spoke on the theme of the Tercentenary year and presented our Synagogue activities within the context of the 300 years of Jewish life in America. He described the tremendous contributions made by American Jews in the areas of thought, culture and industry. He emphasized the fact that the continued existence of the American Jewish community

over this long period of time reflected its inherent vitality and he showed the important role that Kehilath Jeshurun has played and is playing in strengthening this American Jewish community.

Mr. Etra concluded by thanking the membership at large for their splendid cooperation and by expressing his appreciation to his fellow officers, trustees, and the officers of our affiliated organizations for their assistance and generosity.

Reports on our educational activities followed. Abbott S. Bernard, Chairman of the Religious School Committee, spoke of the excellent progress made by the school which had increased its enrollment by 50% and which had been selected by the Jewish Education Committee as a model school.

Martin Markson, Chairman of the Adult Education Institute Committee, evaluated the institute's three pronged program which was highlighted by a popular demonstration-lecture series on "The Jew and the Arts".

A. Phillip Goldsmith, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Ramaz School reviewed the many accomplishments achieved by this outstanding institution and emphasized the importance of its scholarship program.

For the first time, the name of Youth activities was listed on the agenda and under this title Rabbi Sol Roth presented two successful features introduced this year — the Teen-Ager's Club and the Young Marrieds Group.

Our affiliates were then heard from with Mrs. Hyman Abrams speaking of the Sisterhood program and its fine philanthropic projects and Mr. Hyman I. Bucher presenting a resume of the Men's Club year of activities. The final report of the evening was that of the

On the basis of past experience, we should like to make two observations. First, we have found in the past that a number of our members and friends have felt hurt and disappointed because the name of a departed one did not appear. Particularly is this so when the Books are distributed during Yizkor and the Memorial Prayer is recited with a special prayer for those whose names are recorded.

The names which appear must be submitted to the office on an Authorization Form. NO NAME IS RECORDED ON THE STRENGTH OF A PREVIOUS LISTING.

The second point we want to make is that the deadline of May 20th must be adhered to. This is the only way we can have the Book ready for the holiday of Shevuoth.

We urge all those who have not done so to attend to this immediately. An Authorization Form is printed on this page. Fill it out and mail it to us before you overlook it. The Book of Remembrance is consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. Fulfill the pledge by submitting names for the Book of Remembrance.

After the meeting an elaborate reception was given in the Social Hall that afforded our members an opportunity to greet each other, to congratulate the newly elected officers and trustees and to spend an hour of sociability and good fellowship.
