ARMY INVITES RABBI LOOKSTEIN TO CONDUCT RETREAT Rabbi also to Visit Israel and North Africa

SHEVUOTH IN THE SYNAGOGUE

Shevuoth, the Feast of Weeks, commemorates the giving of the Ten Commandments on Mt. Sinai. It is also known as "Chag Habikkurim", the Festival of First Fruits — a very joyous occasion in ancient Palestine, an even more joyous occasion in the State of Israel.

On Friday morning, the first day of Shevuoth, the scriptural reading will include the Ten Commandments. This will be preceded by the chanting of "Akdomos" by the Rabbi and the congregation.

On Saturday, the second day of the festival, the Book of Ruth will be read, and Yizkor services recited. The Book of Remembrance, which the Congregation publishes annually, and in which are recorded the names of those in whose memory a Yizkor offering was made, will be made available to our worshippers at these Memorial services.

Shevuoth is the last major festival of the year — the third of the Shalosh Regalim. As the Festival of the Torah, it bids us to re-dedicate ourselves to the teachings and traditions of our faith. By our presence in the synagogue on the holiday, we affirm our loyalty to the Torah.

On June 15th, Rabbi Lookstein will be leaving for a summer trip that will include important work for the United States Army, United Jewish Appeal and the Bar-Ilan University.

At the invitation of the Secretary of the Army, our Rabbi will conduct a retreat for chaplains in Europe. This retreat will take place in Berchtesgaden, Germany. This is in line with the Army's policy of providing an opportunity for chaplains to get together for a period of time to engage in spiritual study and meditation. As chairman of the Commission of Jewish Chaplains of theJewish Welfare Board, the Rabbi will also visit military installations on the continent.

Visit to North Africa -

The Rabbi has also been invited by the New York Division of the United Jewish Appeal to spend time in French Morocco visiting the Jewish community there and making an on the spot survey. The Rabbi's report will make an important contribution to the life saving work of the U. J. A. in North Africa.

The Rabbi will climax his summer activities by making a trip to Israel where he will attend the dedication ceremony of the Bar-Ilan University in Jerusalem.

As part of his trip, Rabbi Lookstein is prepared to visit or contact boys of our Congregation who are stationed
