Religious School Graduation Part of Service

**REGISTRATION IN RELIGIOUS
SCHOOL NOW IN PROGRESS**

Theodore Comet, principal of the afternoon Religious School, has announced that registration of children for the new school year is now in progress and will continue until the end of June. The new school year will open Monday, September 12th, beginning with which date classes will meet on regular schedule for full instruction.

Parents of children now attending are urged to re-enroll their sons and daughters before they leave for their summer vacations. We should like to point out that re-registration of these children is not automatic; a registration form — which parents will soon receive — must be completed and returned to the school office before any child can be considered enrolled for the new year.

Those of our readers who know of children who are eligible for admission to our Religious School, are urged to refer them to us. We are very pleased with the numerical and programatic growth of the school this year but this has only caused us to set our sights even higher. There are still many boys and girls in the neighborhood who get no Jewish education. Our Primary Class which meets on Sunday mornings accepts children 6 and 7 years old. Our other classes are ready to take in all other children.

Departing from past procedure when they sponsored respectively a Mother's Day and Father's Day Sabbath, our Sisterhood and Men's Club are joining hands, as well as days, to sponsor jointly a Parent's Day Sabbath. This special Sabbath will take place on June 11th.

An unusual feature of that day will be the graduation exercises of the Afternoon Religious School which will be conducted as part of the service. The children of the Religious School will participate in the service and they will join the graduating students as the guests of honor.

Following a pattern that was successfully introduced at our Collegiate Sabbath, the congregation will remove to the Auditorium of the Synagogue House at the close of services where the Graduating Exercises will take place. An interesting program will be presented and Diplomas will be awarded marking the completion of the required course of study in our Religious School. The students who will receive their Diplomas are: Judith Gitelson, David Goodman, Robert Jablon and Frana Mills.

Buffet Kiddush to be Served —

At the conclusion of the exercises a tasty buffet kiddush will be served in the Social Hall by the Sisterhood and Men's Club in honor of the Graduating Class and the students of the School.

The Book of Remembrance, in which are recorded the names of those in whose memory a Yizkor offering was made, was made available to our Worshipers at this Memorial service.
