WORSHIPPERS INSPIRED BY IMPRESSIVE HIGH HOLY DAY SERVICES

RESERVATIONS FOR MEALS IN SUKKAH CAN NOW BE MADE

We are now in the process of making arrangements for Holiday meals to be served in our Sukkah during the first two days of the Sukkoth festival. Full course catered meals will be served on three occasions, Friday evening, September 30th, Saturday and Sunday afternoon, October 1st and 2nd.

Plans for Sukkah meals were formulated in order to render the observance of Jewish holidays more meaningful and more beautiful. Our large and beautifully decorated Sukkah is on the third floor of the Synagogue House, and will be the scene of joyous festivity appropriate to the spirit of Sukkoth.

The price per plate has been set at a nominal \$6.50. This covers everything that will be required, including gratuities.

Forty Reservations Needed -

In order for us to make these arrangements for catered meals we must have at least forty reservations. If we do not have that number we cannot go through with our plans. Therefore if you would like to take advantage of this offer contact the Synagogue Office not later than this Tuesday morning, September 27th. Please do not delay making your reservation.

It is again our pleasure to record that the High Holy Day season was ushered in with services that inspired our worshippers and marked a new high for Kehilath Jeshurun. From the opening notes of the Cantor on the first eve of Rosh Hashanah our congregation participated in a religious experience that they will long remember.

Last year Rabbi Lookstein introduced a novel sermon arrangement. Instead of placing the sermon before the Musaf service, he delivered it towards the conclusion of the service. This arrangement was put into effect this year and again met with great success.

The first day of Rosh Hashanah Rabbi Lookstein preached a powerful sermon on the topic, "A Sense of Security, Religion's Prescription Against Fear". In his talk the Rabbi emphasized that A Sense of Security is generated from within and is not induced from without.

On the second day of Rosh Hashanah our Assistant Rabbi, Sol Roth, delivered an excellent sermon on the topic, "The Pursuit of Power, Where It May Be Found'."

The services this year marked the second time that our Cantor, Jacob Konigsberg, and our Ritual Director, Israel D. Rosenberg, officiated. Mr. Rosenberg chanted the Shacharith prayers and impressed the worshippers with his piety, sincerity and (Contd. on Page 2)

WORSHIPPERS URGED TO ACQUIRE LULAV AND ETHROG

The Sukkoth festival will begin on Friday, Sept. 30th at Sundown. In order to prepare for the holiday, we urge our worshippers to provide themselves with a Lulav and Ethrog, and to arrange for their acquisition without delay.

There are several reasons why we stress this matter. First and foremost, of course, is that Sukkoth cannot properly be observed without making a benediction over these articles. Second, the participation of a greater number of worshippers in the procession in the synagogue, each holding a Lulav and Ethrog, will make for a more impressive ceremony and beautiful service. And we add as a third reason that by making this purchase we are helping our brethren in Israel. Kosher Ethrogim are imported from the groves of Israel where so many depend for their livelihood on the sale of these citrus fruits.

You can thus accomplish many ends by purchasing a Lulav an Ethrog. Our Ritual Director, Mr. Israel D. Rosenberg, will be only too happy to be of assistance to you. A call to the Synagogue Office will bring the desired results.
