SABBATH SEUDAH-SEMINAR TO RESUME MEETING ON NOVEMBER 5th

Always alert to new ways and means of enriching our Synagogue program we initiated a Sabbath Seudah-Seminar last year which met with a great deal of success. The Seminar will be held weekly again this year beginning with Saturday, November 5th.

This activity will again take place on Saturday afternoons and will begin with the Mincha service in the Chapel. The Seminar setting will then change to the Social Hall where light refreshments will be served and Z'miros sung under the direction of Cantor Konigsberg.

The main feature will then follow — a discussion of the Sedra, the Bible portion of the week. Each week a different member will volunteer to lead the discussion. He or she will select one of the major themes found in the weekly portion as the subject for discussion. Our assistant Rabbi, Sol Roth, will act as moderator.

The conclusion of the program will be the ushering out of the Sabbath with the Ma'ariv service and Havdalah.

RECORD TURNOUT ATTENDS MEN'S CLUB SUPPER MEETING**Rabbi Lookstein Delivers Stimulating Lecture on Israel**

Over one hundred and twenty members and friends of the Men's Club turned out last Tuesday evening to participate in the first supper meeting of the year, and to listen to a brilliant lecture by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein.

Proceedings got under way at 6:30 o'clock when cocktails and hors d'oeuvres were served in the Social Hall. Then everyone sat down to a very tasty and hearty meal. After a good deal of socializing the meal was concluded with the saying of grace.

The main feature of the evening was, of course, the talk delivered by Rabbi Lookstein on the topic "Inside Israel — an eye witness report of conditions and problems." As our readers know, Rabbi Lookstein visited Israel this past summer and had an opportunity to personally view the conditions in that country and to meet with many of its leaders. The Rabbi made an incisive analysis of the accomplishments made by the Jewish State and of the many problems that have yet to be resolved.

The Rabbi presented the picture of Israel within the context of the over-all world situation. He showed how the struggle between Russia and the United States over control of the Middle Eastern area affected the Arab countries as well as Israel. The intervention of Russia into this region with the shipment of arms and technicians reverses the present balance of military power and constitutes a great danger to the Jewish state.

The Western countries have not as yet articulated a policy plan which would counteract the Russian move and at the same time calm the rising tensions in that area. In spite of the dark picture, the Rabbi emphasized that the miraculous victory of 1948 against even greater odds manifested the inherent vitality of the Jewish people and its ability to meet and overcome seemingly insurmountable obstacles.

Rabbi Lookstein was introduced by Hyman I. Bucher, president of the Men's Club, who greeted the members and friends present and who spoke of the many activities that the Men's Club continues to provide. He called upon the membership to participate actively in these activities throughout the year.

All in all it was an outstanding evening composed of an impressive talk, a stimulating discussion, a tasty meal and the famous Men's Club good fellowship.

The next meeting of the Men's Club will be a Forum Meeting which will be held on Tuesday evening, November 22nd.
