
# HON. MAXWELL M. RABB TO ADDRESS MEN'S CLUB FORUM MEETING NOVEMBER 22

The Hon. Maxwell M. Rabb, Secretary of the Cabinet of the United States and Associate Counsel to President Dwight D. Eisenhower, will be the guest speaker at the Men's Club's initial Open Forum Meeting for the 1955-56 season, according to the announcement of Club President Hyman I. Bucher. This meeting which is open to all, members, non-members and women, will be held on Tuesday, November 22, at 8:30 p.m. at the Synagogue.

Mr. Rabb's talk, the announcement went on to say, is entitled "America's

Forward Road." It will be a discussion of the international and economic future of this country and of the challenges we face.

Only 45 years of age, Mr. Rabb has already had a long career of public service. This career got underway in 1937 when Mr. Rabb was Secretary to Senator Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., of Massachusetts, now United States Ambassador to the United Nations. He then went on to become Secretary to Senator Sinclair Weeks, now the sec-' retary of Commerce. During World

## NOTES ON THE WEEKLY BIBLE PORTION Vayera

Chapter XVIII describes Abraham as a marvelous host. Observe the extent to which he exerts himself in behalf of his guests; but did you note the ingredients of the meal he served them? What is wrong? See Dr. Hertz' commentary on verse 8 for the explanation. Do you think that it is adequate?

Chapter XIX describes the destruction of Sodom. Lot's wife looked back and "she became a pillar of salt". For an explanation of this "miraculous" occurrence see Dr. Hertz on Verse 26. Also interesting is his commentary on Verse 28 which points to the archaeological findings which confirm the existence of the ancient city of Sodom.

Did you know that Chapter XXI is read during the service on the first day of Rosh Hashonah and Chapter XXII is read on the second day? Why do you think that these chapters were selected rather than the numerous others in the Bible? See Dr. Hertz' comment at the end of Chapter XXI.

See also Dr. Hertz' very important exposition of the meaning of the "Binding of Isaac". It may be found among the additional notes at the end of the Book of Genesis.

War II Mr. Rabb was a Lieutenant in the United States Navy (Amphibious Forces) and after the conclusion of the war he became the legal consultant to Secretary of the Navy James E. Forrestal.

An Associate Counsel to President Eisenhower, Mr. Rabb assisted in carrying out the President's directive to end discrimination in Federal establishments and he is chief presidential advisor on civil rights matters.

A native of Boston, a graduate of Harvard College and the Harvard University School of Law, Mr. Rabb has also managed to practice law in Boston between his periods of public service.

In announcing the Rabb appearance here, Mr. Bucher stated, "Kehilath Jeshurun's Men's Club is proud to present so able a speaker as Max Rabb for the opening night of our Forum Series. Republican, Democrat, or Socialist — whatever you are — there is something for you to learn from this man, there is something for you to hear on November 22 at 8:30 p.m."
