The annual Thanksgiving Service of the congregation will be held this year on Thursday morning, November 24th, at 11 o'clock in the Synagogue. These services, which spiritualize the holiday of Thanksgiving, have enjoyed a wide and enviable reputation for their impressiveness and for the high calibre of the guest speakers who have addressed them.

Our guest speaker this year will be Dr. Buell G. Gallagher, president of the City College of New York. Rabbi Lookstein will again conduct the services. A choir, under the direction of Oscar Julius, will assist Cantor Konigsberg.

THEME OF ADULT INSTITUTE LECTURE SERIES**

Talmud and Hebrew Classes Begin This Wednesday, November 16

The Adult Education Program Committee has announced that the Kehilath Jeshurun Adult Institute will feature this year, a series of six lectures on the theme, "Modern Thought and the Jewish Spirit". This series will begin on Wednesday evening, November 30th at 9:00 p.m. in the Social Hall.

In addition to the lecture series, classes in Hebrew and Talmud will be held on Wednesday evenings from 8:00 to 9:00 p.m. beginning with this Wednesday, November 16th. Also being offered is a class in Liturgical Procedures which meets every Saturday afternoon, one-half hour prior to the Mincha service.

The six part lecture series will be opened with Dr. Bernard Heller who will speak on the topic of "Psychoanalysis and Religion — Foes or Friends?" Succeeding lectures will be held on December 7th and 14th. After a mid-year recess, the series will continue on January 4th, 11th, and 18th.

The class in Talmud will again be conducted by Rabbi Sol Roth. The class will meet in the Synagogue Library. Some familiarity with the Talmud will be a pre-requisite for this course.

The Hebrew class will be conducted by Mrs. Alice Rothkowitz who has been in charge of this course for the past five years. This class will meet in room 401. Both these courses begin this Wednesday, November 16th.

The Liturgical Procedure class, which will convene a week from this Saturday, has as its aim the development of a reading fluency in the prayer book and a capacity to follow prayers at the Religious services. It will also provide the training necessary to officiate at services and to learn the cantillations for the weekly portion and the prophetic reading.

The Adult Education Committee consists of Martin Markson, Chairman, Dr. Theodore R. Fink, Joseph N. Friedman, Gerald Goldstein, Norman Halper, Judge George Postel and Dr. Ned Wachtel.

**NOTES ON THE
WEEKLY BIBLE PORTION
Haye Sarah**

Chapter XXIII tells of Sarah's death and Abraham's concern for her burial. This is the first reference to burial in the Bible. See Dr. Hertz on Verse 4 where he points out that the practice of cremation is alien to Judaism. What do you think is the reason?

The same chapter describes Abraham's purchase of the cave of the Machpelah from Ephron the Hittite. This transaction is described in Verse 8 through 18. Lawyers and dealers in real estate will be interested in evaluating the procedures involved in the execution of this deal in the light of modern legal techniques. Business men will be delighted and stimulated by the bargaining described in this passage. To get the full flavor of this transaction do not miss Dr. Hertz' comments on these verses.

Chapter XXIV describes Isaac's courtship and marriage. In certain aspects, the ancient customs as set forth in this chapter contrast with our own. In others, they are amazingly modern. A valuable procedure which can be utilized to find the "right girl" is described in Verse 14. Bachelors, don't miss it!

Is love more important before marriage or after marriage? See Dr. Hertz' comment on Verse 67 of the same chapter.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE A HOST

There is an old Jewish custom that when one celebrates a happy occasion it is shared with fellow members of the congregation. It is also a custom when observing the Yahrzeit to provide refreshments in a religious — social setting. Our members and friends have an opportunity to be hosts on two occasions. One occasion is the sponsoring of the Kiddush which is provided each Saturday morning after services. The other is sponsoring the refreshments that are served at the weekly Sabbath Seudah-Seminar.
