NOTES ON THE WEEKLY PORTION Mikez

Chapter XLI emphasizes an important ingredient of Joseph's personality. Joseph, the young man who liked to dream, at the age of 30 becomes a man eminently qualified to deal with a practical problem on a national scale. Being a "dreamer" in adolescence is apparently useful for success in maturity (see Dr. Hertz on Verse 33 to 36).

Why did Joseph, in the incidents described in Chapters XLII, XLIII and XLIV, deal so harshly with his brothers? Did he want to retaliate against them for selling him into slavery? A revengeful person does not cry (see Verse 24 of Chapter XLII and Verse 30 of Chapter XLIIII). Nor would he, were he filled with hatred, return his brothers' money to them in the manner described (Verse 25 Chapter XLII). The reason for his apparent cruelty to his brothers is suggested by Dr. Hertz in his comment on Verse 7 of Chapter XLII.

Chapter XLIII describes the brothers' second trip to Egypt for food. This time they must bring Benjamin with them. To allay their father's fears over losing his youngest son, both Reuben and Judah offer to be held personally responsible for him. Compare Reuben's wild assurance (Verse 37 of Chapter XLII) with Judah's statement (Verses 8 and 9 of Chapter XLIII) and see Dr. Hertz on Verse 9.
