YOUTH TO CONDUCT ENTIRE PURIM SERVICE SUNDAY MORNING, FEBRUARY 26th

The festive holiday of Purim will be ushered in this year on Saturday evening, February 25th, with our regular Purim Service. On Sunday morning, February 26th, we will hold our special Purim Service in the main Synagogue which will be turned over again in

"JEWISH LIFE IN PERSIA" AT FEBRUARY 25th SEUDAH SEMINAR

Our Synagogue will begin its celebration of the Purim holiday with a special feature at its Seudah Seminar on Saturday afternoon, February 25th. At that time Dr. M. Landau will deliver a report on "Jewish Life in Persia." This talk will be very appropriate

This talk will be very appropriate for the Sabbath preceding Purim since the story of the Megillah occurred in Persia.

Dr. Landau lived in Persia for many years. From 1944 to 1955 he served as Deputy Manager of the Teheran Office of the Joint Distribution Committee. It was the function of that office to help Jewish refugees who had been deported to Russia. Dr. Landau's talk will be based on his personal observation of Jewish Life in Persia.

We extend a cordial invitation to all members and friends to attend this interesting Seudah Seminar program and to stay on for the Purim service. its entirety to the young men of our congregational family.

From the **Birchot Hashachar** through the Torah reading, to reading of the Megillah, the service will be entrusted to capable hands from among the students of Ramaz School. These students have been trained for their duties by Mr. Isaac B. Rapaport, an instructor in the Ramaz Upper School where he is faculty advisor to the Synagogue Service Club.

The practice of having our own young men take charge has become one of the highly anticipated events of our Synagogue Year. Introduced several years ago it has received city wide acclaim and has been instrumental in bringing to our Synagogue larger congregations with every passing year.

Following the service, which will begin at 9:30 A.M., brunch will be served, at which members of the Sisterhood and Men's Club will act as hosts. All of our worshippers Sunday morning, including the children, will be invited to partake of the brunch which will be served in the School lunchroom.

Purim is a holiday that appeals to young and old alike, and we urge all our members and friends to be sure to bring their children with them. The pupils of our Ramaz School and our Afternoon Religious School will be our special guests and all children will be given noise makers to accompany the reading of the Megillah.

NOTES ON THE WEEKLY PORTION Terumah

This week's portion of the Bible describes the blueprints of the Tabernacle and its furniture. The symbolisms suggested by the Sanctuary produced a wealth of interpretations which enriched Jewish life. The full significance of this portion cannot be grasped without a reading of at least one Rabbinic commentary on it.

The purpose of the Sanctuary is described in Verse 8 of Chapter XXV. Note the very important conclusion which Dr. Hertz derives from the phrase "dwell among them."

The symbolism expressed by the Tabernacle did not always suggest clear interpretations. For example, the reason for "the showbread" was not evident to Maimonides. See Dr. Hertz on Verse 30 of the same chapter.

Ibn Ezra offers an interesting comment on Verse 6 of Chapter XXVI. He is quoted by Dr. Hertz.

The meaning and significance of the altar is suggested by its Hebrew word, each letter of which is the first initial of a word which explains one aspect of the altar. See Dr. Hertz on Verse 1 of Chapter XXVII.
