Rabbi Lookstein clarifies difficult point at opening supper lecture

Rabbi Lookstein will preach this Sabbath at 11:00 a.m. "CLOUDS OVER THE TABERNACLE" The Role of Crisis in Personal and Collective Life The annual Sunday Supper-Lecture series sponsored by the Men's Club opened last Sunday with a large and enthusiastic audience of more than 200 members and friends of the congregation. As in previous years, the engrossing talk was delivered by Rabbi Lookstein, who discussed "Existentialism."

In planning his talk, the Rabbi explained, he had intended to divide the topic into three sections – secular Existentialism, Christian Existentialism and Jewish Existentialism. After he had really gotten into the subject, however, he found that each of these three sections deserved an evening in its own right. Consequently, he decided to discuss secular Existentialism the first night and to leave the religious Existentialism for the second lecture on March 18.

Speaking before an enraptured audience that listened intently to every word, the Rabbi explained that Existentialism teaches there is no God and no Divine Providence. Man is what he is because he wills it so. Confronted by complete responsibility for himself and his actions, man is assailed by a variety of moods, foremost among them being anguish and forlornness. Having no guide outside himself, the existentialist man must act in accordance with his own instincts and emotions. To the existentialist, only action is valid; feelings are recognizable only insofar as they are expressed in action.

Summing up, Rabbi Lookstein said, "Existentialism does not propound a philosophy of man. It is, as one of its sharp critics described it, metaphysical pornography. It paints a portrait not of man but of Univox — with a will.

Existentialism, therefore, is not a solution of, but a response to, the modern crisis."

Following the talk, there was a spirited discussion period. The questions asked by members of the audience indicated that, though the subject was probably new to most of them, the presentation had left them with a good working grasp of what Existentialism is.

This lecture was the first in the series of three on the general subject "Man in Search of God: Three Modern Philosophies of Judaism." The second lecture on March 18 was originally scheduled for the topic "Man is Not Alone - The Neo-Mysticism of Abraham J. Heschel." However, because of the vastness of the scope of Existentialism, the evening will be spent in a discussion of general religious and Jewish Existentialism with the emphasis on Kierkegaarde, Franz Rosenzweig and Martin Buber. At the concluding lecture on April 8th, Rabbi Lookstein will combine the topics of Neo-Mysticism and Neo-Halachaism.

If you have not already made your reservations for the second and third lectures, please call the Synagogue Office as soon as possible. Based on the enthusiastic and large attendance at last Sunday's lecture, we anticipate another capacity audience. Laws relating to Passover will be the subject of a series of three lectures to be delivered by Rabbi Sol Roth on the next three Saturday afternoons, one hour before the Mincha Service.

The first talk will be given this Saturday, March 10th, on the topic "What is Chometz." The second lecture will be held on March 17th on the subject "Preparing the home for Passover." The final discussion will be held on March 24th and at that time the topic will be "The Passover Seder."

At this series emphasis will be placed on the Talmudic sources of the Passover customs and rituals as well as the problems that arise in the modern home. Both men and women are invited and we especially urge the women to attend.
