PREPARING FOR PASSOVER

There are several important matters that should be borne in mind during the Passover season.

"Kosher for Passover" -

A label bearing the inscription, "Kosher for Passover" is not necessarily a guarantee that the article so labled is permissible for Passover use. Unfortunately, there are the unscrupulous who take advantage, and the credulous who fall prey. Whatever food article, therefore, that is purchased for Passover and which requires endorsement should indicate that it has the approval of a recognized rabbi or rabbinic organization. Last week, to help our members with their Passover purchases, we enclosed with our bulletin a list of "Kosher for Passover" items published by the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations.

Search for Chometz -

On the evening before the eve of Passover (this year, Sundāy evening, March 25th), every Jewish home should be inspected to make sure that all "chometz" has been removed. Like every religious practice, there is a ceremony connected with this inspection. It is well to observe that ceremony, not alone because it is a religious requirement, but because it affords an opportunity to impress the children of every household.

Sale of Chometz -

The important ritual of "m'chiras chometz" the sale of chometz, must be attended to by Sunday, March 25th. Rabbi Lookstein will be available for this purpose during the pre-Passoverweek beginning Monday, March 19th. For those who cannot come in person, we provide a form, in this bulletin, which must be properly filled out, signed and returned to the Rabbi no later than Sunday, March 25th.

Disposal of Chometz -

No chometz may be eaten after 9:45 A.M. on Monday, March 26th. All chometz should be completely disposed of by 10:30 Monday morning.

Service for the First-born -

It is obligatory upon every first-born who cannot observe the fast on Monday, March 26th, to attend the special service on that day and to participate, at its conclusion, in the light collation that is served. The services for the first-born (Siyum Bechorim) will be held in the Chapel on Monday, March 26th, as part of the regular morning service which will begin at 7:30.
