# PASSOVER GAILY CELEBRATED BY OUR RAMAZ AND RELIGIOUS SCHOOL SCHILDREN

The festive holiday of Passover is being fully celebrated by the children of our Ramaz and afternoon Religious Schools in their many classroom activities and in a series of Model Sedorim that attract not only the children but many parents as well.

The spirit of Passover is felt in our Synagogue in many ways. The lobby of the Synagogue House is gaily decorated with Passover motifs as are the classrooms and the Auditorium. The singing of "Ma Nishtana," "Echad Mi Yodea," "Dayenu" and other Seder songs can be heard all week in the classrooms and in the halls. The climax of all this preparation is the beautiful Model Sedorim conducted by our Ramaz and afternoon Religious School chadren.

On Thursday and Friday mornings, March 22nd and 23rd, the Ramaz students will conduct their Sedorim in the Auditorium of the Synagogue House. The Religious School will hold its Seder on Thursday afternoon.

Each Seder will feature the chanting of Kiddush and the singing of all the special Passover songs, Kings and Queens preside over each class and the Seder ceremony is conducted in the traditional Passover manner.

The series of Model Sedorim is one of the high points of the activity year of both Ramaz School and the Religious School. They are important not only for the children but for the many parents who enjoy the rich experience of witnessing the religious and educational growth of their children in the beautiful setting of their school.

A remarkable display of congregational and intellectual loyalty took place this past Sunday evening when a fine turnout of members and friends braved a raging snowstorm to attend Rabbi Lookstein's second supper lecture. Practically all of those who made reservations came, whether by car or on foot when roads were impassible (snow shoes would have been more appropriate). Like the motto of our postmen, "neither snow, nor rain, nor sleet," succeeded in holding back these enthusiasts.

And what greeted them after their arrival? As it is written in the Ethics of our Fathers, "according to the labor is the reward," and since the audience labored greatly to get here they were treated to what was possibly the finest talk ever given at a Supper Lecture.

Continuing the theme begun at his first lecture Rabbi Lookstein spoke on "The Religious Existentialism of Kierkegaard and Franz Rosenzweig." The rabbi pointed out how Existentialism was an anti-intellectual revolt against the enthroned position of Reason.

Kierkegaard, the tormented and guilt laden thinker, found no satisfaction in the calm, intellectually reasoned out philosophy of Hegel. He declared that man discovered the truth through his own existence — that is through his own personal experiences. God is found not by an elaborate system of thought, but by a deeply felt emotional introspection.

The second half of the Rabbi's talk was devoted to the German Jewish Philosopher, Franz Rosenzweig. A young man of assimilationist upbringing, Rosenzweig at first thought of turning to Christianity to fulfill his spiritual needs. However, he decided to do so through Judaism, as a learned and not as an ignorant Jew. In learn-

ing about Judaism he found what he was looking for, and instead of passing through — stayed.

Rosenzweig posited that the three major elements in Judaism were God, Man and the World. Contact between God and Man is made through Revelation; between God and the World through Creation; and between Man and the World through Redemption.

In concluding, Rabbi Lookstein stated that Rosenzweig's Existentialism brought forth many new creative and important ideas and was possibly the only position that a Jew like Rosenzweig, who was not rooted in Jewish learning, could make. While we can learn much from Jewish Existentialism, the position of Orthodoxy rests on much more solid ground.

This lecture was the second in a series devoted to "Man in Search of God: Three Modern Philosophies of Judaism." In his first lecture Rabbi Lookstein spoke on the secular or atheistic Existenialism. The third and concluding lecture will be devoted to developing the theme "Man Is not Alone—The Neo-Chasidism of Abraham J. Heschel."

The concluding lecture will take place on Sunday, April 8th, and we urge our readers to make their reservations early.

#### PREPARING FOR PASSOVER

(For the benefit of our readers we repeat the Passover preparation instructions which we printed last week.)

#### "Kosher for Passover" -

A label bearing the inscription, "Kosher for Passover" is not necessarily a guarantee that the article so labeled is permissible for Passover use. Unfortunately, there are the unscrupulous who take advantage, and the credulous who fall prey. Whatever food article, therefore, that is purchased for Passover and which requires endorsement should indicate that it has the approval of a recognized rabbi or rabbinic organization. Last week, to help our members with their Passover purchases, we enclosed with our bulletin a list of "Kosher for Passover" items published by the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations.

#### Search for Chometz -

On the evening before the eve of Passover (this year, Sunday evening, March 25th), every Jewish home should be inspected to make sure that all "chometz" has been removed. Like every religious practice, there is a ceremony connected with this inspection. It is well to observe that ceremony, not alone because it is a religious requirement, but because it affords an opportunity to impress the children of every household.

#### Sale of Chometz -

The important ritual of "m'chiras chometz" the sale of chometz, must be attended to by this Sunday, March 25th. Rabbi Lookstein is available for week. For those who cannot come in person, we provide a form, in this bulletin, which must be properly filled out, signed and returned to the Rabbi no later than this Sunday, March 25th.

#### Disposal of Chometz -

No chometz may be eaten after 9:45 A.M. on Monday, March 26th. All chometz should be completely disposed of by 10:30 Monday morning.

#### Service for the First-born -

It is obligatory upon every first-born who cannot observe the fast on Monday, March 26th, to attend the special service on that day and to participate, at its conclusion, in the light collation that is served. The services for the first-born (Siyum Bechorim) will be held in the Chapel on Monday, March 26th, as part of the regular morning service which will begin at 7:30.
