The Sabbath Service is scheduled to begin at 9 o'clock and we ask that all guests arrive as close to that hour as possible. For the younger students of our School we have made special arrangements. They will meet in the Chapel at 10:15 for a special service

that will be geared to their level. At approximately 11:30 they will be taken to the Main Synagogue to join in the Musaf Service.
