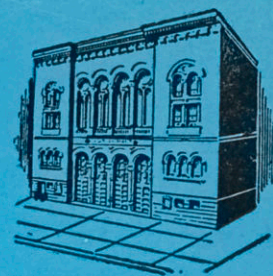

Dr. Pierre Van Paassen

Pierre Van Paassen has carved for himself a distinguished career as journalist, author, scholar and ardent champion of the Zionist Cause. Born in the Netherlands, Dr. Van Paassen emigrated to Canada as a young man and served in the British Army in France during World War I, where he was decorated for bravery on several occasions. After the war he became a newspaper man covering the major world events. He was expelled from Germany by the Nazis and from France by Pierre Laval.

Pierre Van Paassen's efforts on behalf of Zionism stem from his first visit to Palestine in 1925. He frequently visited the Jewish communities of Eastern Europe as well as the Arabic
