RABBI HOWARD LEVINE TO LECTURE ON "JEREMIAH" AT ADULT INSTITUTE DEC. 5th

"Jeremiah — the Tragic Prophet" will be the theme of the Adult Institute lecture that will be delivered on Wednesday evening, December 5th, by Rabbi Howard Levine, instructor of Religious Studies at Stern College.

Rabbi Levine will present a complete record of the life, growth and dynamic relationship to his times of this prophet who was forced against his own will to oppose the majority and as a consequence suffered physical abuse and

contempt. Jeremiah was a preacher of defeatism in a time of optimism. He was a critic of the temple and its worship in a period of religious self-confidence and he was a prophet of doom for his people whom he loved above all.

Rabbi Levine is well equipped to handle this moving and dynamic material. He is spiritual leader of Young Israel of Forest Hills, and has studied

A MESSAGE FROM FEDERATION

A gift to Federation provides not one kind of kindness but one hundred and sixteen, not one kind of service but a thousand different services. Federation is many institutions—116 hospitals and social service agencies—which concern themselves with virtually every kind of illness, every kind of misfortune. When you give to Federation you give the means to save the lives of those near and dear to you as surely as the stranger you have never met . . . you answer the hopes of all our children, our aged, our handicapped.

The second in the series of lectures on "The Prophets Speak to us Anew" will be delivered on this Wednesday evening, November 28th, when Rabbi Norman Frimer will speak on "Isaiah — Critic, Counsellor and Comforter."

The fourth lecture in the series will be delivered on Wednesday evening, December 12th, when Rabbi Morris Besdin will speak on "Jonah — The Prophet, His Mission and his Message."

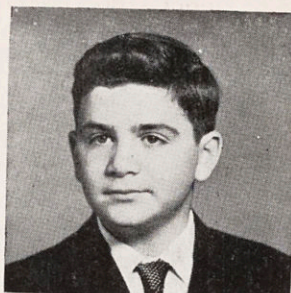
