AN ISRAELI FATHER WRITES TO BEN GURION

The following is a letter which a father who lost his son in the Sinal Peninsula wrote to Prime Minister Ben Gurion. It is an English translation of the original, and we thought that our readers would be interested in it as an example of the spirit that now prevails in Israel. The letter follows:

"I am one of the one hundred and fifty fathers who lost their sons in the recent fighting. My only son Jaier fell in combat near Rafa on the first of November. He was only 20 years old.

"I would like to tell you that with all the pain that I feel in my heart at the loss of my son, the light of my life, I have no complaints whatever. What is more important, believe me, is that had my son known in advance about the fate that awaits him he would not have hesitated one moment from pursuing the course which he followed.

"You, Premier David Ben Gurion, who had to bear the heavy responsibilities for our people, and who had to reach the decisions which determined the destiny of our children; you, whose heart aches for every young flower that was nipped — you all of us must console perhaps no less than we who lost our children need consolation.

"I will be amply rewarded if my words will to some degree relieve the burden that presses upon your heart and will give you added strength and courage."

To this letter Mr. Ben Gurion answered as follows:

"I was deeply moved when I read your words. I do not know whether parents among other nations would have written as you wrote. Your letter deserves to be preserved in the archives of our people as a noble manifestation of moral courage and high loyalty to the Fatherland. I am incapable of thanking you for your wonderful words.

"May the like of you increase in Israel."
