## ADULT INSTITUTE CONCLUDES FIRST HALF OF LECTURE SERIES

The first half of the Adult Institute Lecture series on the theme "The Prophets Speak to Us Anew" has been concluded and after several weeks of winter recess the second half will get under way on Wednesday, January 9th. At that time Dr. Sidney B. Hoenig will return to discuss "Zechariah — Not by Might but by My Spirit." Rabbis Norman Frimer, Howard Levine and Morris Besdin will complete the second lecture portion on the Wednesdays of January 16, 23 and 30.

We have been very pleased this year with the presentations made by our guest speakers and also with the fine turn out and response on the part of our members and friends. We recognize that other commitments do not permit adults to attend educational programs as often as they would like but a fine audience has been on hand each week to listen to the speakers. Our speakers were uniformly good and those who attended were well rewarded.

We would like to point out an unusual experience that was shared when Rabbi Frimer was with us.

Instead of just delivering a lecture, Rabbi Frimer prepared a pamphlet of excerpts from the Book of Isaiah and this pamphlet was distributed to every one present and used as a text. The audience participated by reading these excerpts and by discussing their meaning. This was the first time we attempted this technique in our lecture series, and the experiment proved to be unusually successful. Instead of merely hearing conclusions stated by a speaker the audience was able by reading the basic text, to come to conclusions on their own.
