## RABBI LOOKSTEIN AND PROFESSOR DRAKE TO BE FEATURED AT SISTERHOOD AND MEN'S CLUB JOINT MEETING FEBRUARY 26th

An unusual program, combining filmed and live interviews, has been arranged by our Men's Club and Sisterhood for its joint meeting on Tuesday evening, February 26th. At that time a kinescope will be shown of the television program "The Way to Go" in which Rabbi Lookstein was interviewed by Professor Ormond Drake.

The TV program which will be shown on film, took place on Sunday morning, November 11th, as part of the series in which Jewish, Protestant and Catholic theologians are interviewed for the purpose of eliciting from them their basic philosophy of life.

At the session in which Rabbi Lookstein was interviewed, Professor Drake, director of the Town Hall Forum, posed many complex and difficult questions. Because of the shortage of time it was impossible to deal with them in full length, and in view of the nature of the discussion we feel it would be of interest to our members to have it continued.

The joint meeting will begin with a showing of the kinescope and afterwards Professor Drake will continue in person the interview begun on his TV show. Professor Drake is one of our outstanding educators, lecturers and TV personalities. He has served as moderator on several of our finer cultural TV shows. He has also served as Consultant in Speaking for the New York Stock Exchange and other large businesses as well as for the Radio Corporation of America and the National Broadcasting Company.

Professor and Assistant Dean at the University College of Arts and Science, Professor Drake has held the position of director of the Board of Public Occasions at N. Y. U. It is a pleasure for us to have Professor Drake participate in this program.

We urge our members and friends to jot down the date of February 26th on their calendars to make sure they attend. The meeting will begin at 8:30 o'clock and will be held in the Auditorium of the Synagogue House.
