


Year Book Chairman Jules Podell Gets 1957 Campaign Under Way

RABBI HIAT TO ACT AS MODERATOR AT JOINT MEETING ON FEBRUARY 26

Rabbi Philip Hiat, co-ordinator of Radio and TV for the New York Board of Rabbis, will act as moderator at the meeting sponsored jointly by our Men's Club and Sisterhood on Tuesday evening, February 26th.

As we announced last week, this is the meeting that will feature a filmed and live interview of Rabbi Lookstein by Prof. Ormond Drake, Director of the Town Hall Forum. Rabbi Hiat, who acted as producer of the original program that will be shown on film, has consented to join us as moderator for the live interview that will follow the filmed interview.

Rabbi Hiat is producer for NBC-TV of their Sunday morning Children's program "The Fourth R". For CBS-TV he produces the teen age program "Look and Live." In addition he is consultant for the shows "Lamp Unto My Feet" and "Church of the Air." He also acts as producer of the Jewish section of "The Way to Go" which is the show on which Rabbi Lookstein appeared.

Four programs produced during the past year by Rabbi Hiat were selected as among the best Religious Television Programs of 1956.
