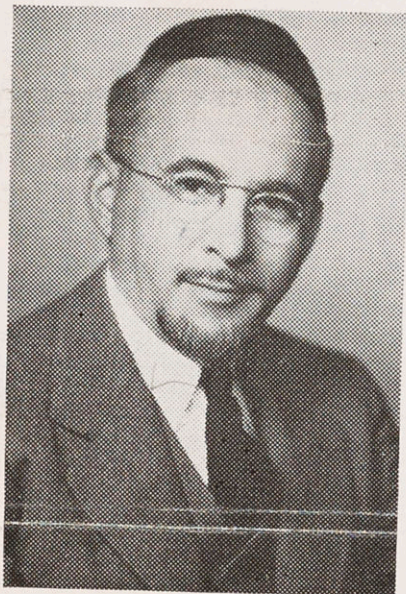


TESTIMONIAL SABBATH for Dr. SAMUEL BELKIN TO BE HELD APRIL 6th Congregation to Honor Yeshiva University Head



DR. SAMUEL BELKIN

On Saturday, April 6th, our Congregation will observe Yeshiva University Sabbath. In accordance with our annual custom, our thoughts and efforts will be concerned on that day with the foremost institution of combined Jewish and general learning in the land.

It is natural that on such a Sabbath we should pay tribute to the architect of this world famed institution. Dr. Belkin, President of the Yeshiva University, is an esteemed Trustee of our Congregation. We will therefore be showing respect and recognition to one of the Kehilath Jeshurun family.

Dr. Belkin has presided over the fortunes of Yeshiva University for thirteen years. Under his leadership it grew from an institution of some 700 students to one of 3,000 students. It assumed the status of a University fully

accredited by the academic accrediting agencies of the country. Schools devoted to graduate study were added, such as the Graduate School of Education and Community Administration, the Bernard Revel Graduate School, and the Harry Fishel School for Higher Jewish Studies. A college for women, The Stern College for Women, was established. Finally, the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, the first and only college of medicine under Jewish auspices, came into being. All this was done under the inspired leadership of Dr. Samuel Belkin.

How proud we of Kehilath Jeshurun should feel that such a benefactor of Jewish learning is in our midst. He is a great Talmudic giant and an acknowledged authority on Hellenistic literature. He is as much at home in the Greek classics as he is in the folios of the Talmud. It is good to have an opportunity to pay tribute to such an outstanding personality.

We hope that our congregants will fill the Synagogue to capacity on Saturday April 6th. Our association with Yeshiva University goes back to its very inception. Many of the sons of Kehilath Jeshurun are Trustees of the University. Some thirty Jeshurunites are founders of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. The President of the Congregation, Mr. Max J. Etra, is the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the University. Our Rabbi is not alone an alumnus, but also a member of the faculty of the University. Our Assistant Rabbi, our Executive Director, our Ritual Director and many members of the faculty of Ramaz are graduates of some school or department of the University.

The Sabbath we are about to celebrate is really in the nature of a Congregational "Simcha". Let us all join in it.

MEN'S CLUB TO SPONSOR BLOOD BANK PROGRAM

Dr. Robert Wallach, Men's Club President, announced that the Men's Club is undertaking the sponsorship of a Blood Bank to which all members are urged to donate blood. This bank will be used to provide our members and their families with blood in times of need.

Prospective donors are asked to get in touch with our local Red Cross Blood Bank Center at 323 Lexington Avenue. Call MU 9-1000 and ask for the Appointment Desk. The Center is open Monday and Thursday from 2:00 to 7:45 P.M. and on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 10 A.M. to 3:45 P.M. When donating blood please mention that credit is to be given to the Kehilath Jeshurun Men's Club.

Arrangements with the Red Cross provide that two-thirds of the blood donated will be credited to our own group and in addition unlimited quantities of blood fractions will be made available without charge. The remaining third is used for general community needs which include shipments to the Armed Forces.

In announcing the program Dr. Wallach emphasized that by giving blood we would perform a most worthy act. We have had occasion in the past to see the need for blood dramatically illustrated by the sudden illness of several of our members. We should be prepared for emergencies and we urge as many members as possible to participate in this project. Dr. Theodore R. Fink is acting as consultant in this important activity.

YESHIVA U. TALMUD TORAH COMMISSION TO HOLD CONFERENCE THIS SUNDAY

Only a few months ago the Yeshiva University Synagogue Council in affiliation with the Jewish Education Committee formed a Metropolitan Commission on Talmud Torah education. The purpose of this commission is to service and coordinate the Afternoon Religious Schools of traditional synagogues in New York City.

This coming Sunday afternoon, March 31st, the Metropolitan Commission is holding its first conference at Stern College, Lexington Avenue and 35th Street. This conference will deal with three vital areas pertaining to Religious Education.

Our esteemed trustee, Dr. Samuel Belkin, president of Yeshiva University, will address the conference at its plenary session. Our devoted member, Dr. Victor Wouk, is doing a splendid job as conference chairman. Our esteemed trustee, Nathan Salzman, has been active on the planning committee while our Executive Director, Theodore Comet, will participate in one of the panel sessions.

We are glad to see our membership assuming an important role in this newly formed commission.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL CHILDREN RAISE \$50 AT CARNIVAL

The sound of enthusiastic voices and the sight of excited children having fun at a carnival was the setting this past Sunday morning when our Religious School children held their Annual Purim Carnival.
