

YOUTH GROUP HOLDS MEETING OUTDOORS

With the coming of beautiful weather our Saturday afternoon Youth Group is moving to Central Park to hold its outdoor meetings. This Saturday afternoon the Group is again scheduled to get together at 4 o'clock in the Synagogue Library and from there, weather permitting, proceed to the park.

The youth group programs consist of discussions on Jewish topics of interest to teenagers. Refreshments are served each week and a session of Israeli folk dances is held. All boys between 15 and 19, and girls between 14 and 17 are invited to join the group.

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE AGAIN TO BE PUBLISHED FOR SHEVUOTH

The 1957 Book of Remembrance is now in the process of being prepared for publication so that it will be ready for our worshippers for the Shevuoth Festival. The Book of Remembrance, since its origin several years ago, has become an institution in Kehilath Jeshurun. It is used on the four occasions of the year when the Yizkor service is conducted, containing as it does an appropriate memorial prayer together with the names of the departed ones to be memorialized.

Members of our congregational family are well aware of the important role which the Book of Remembrance plays, and the use to which it is put during the year. There is, however, one point worth re-emphasizing-particularly for the benefit of those who are not familiar with the nature of this publication, namely, that it is by no means a fund-raising project. It is free of every aspect of commercialism, and consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. In order that such a pledge may be properly fulfilled, we give our congregants an opportunity to make a Yizkor offering every year before the Shevuoth holiday when the Book of Remembrance appears. The names of the departed, in whose memory the offering is made, are included in the Book which is placed in the hands of our worshippers at the Memorial Services.

In order to stress the purely religious character of the offering, it has been limited to no less than five dollars and no more than ten dollars for each name to be memorialized. Thus, the offering is purged of any material tinge, and represents purely a token of reverence for the departed.

Correspondence from the Synagogue Office with regard to the 1957 Book of Remembrance is now being sent out. Among the literature is an Authorization Card which is to be returned to the Office, giving the names of those to be included in the Book. The task of preparing the little volume is an exacting and time consuming one; it requires painstaking effort to check and re-check the many names that are submitted. We ask, therefore, that those who wish to have names inserted in this year's Book of Remembrance, submit them to the Office, wthout delay, on the Authorization Card they received.

Persian-born Dr. Fatemi, now Professor of Social Science at Fairleigh Dickinson University, has had an active career as diplomat, author and teacher. As a diplomat, Dr. Fatemi represented Iran at the United Nations, and in 1950-1953 he was the Iranian delegate to the Conference of the United Nations Economic Social and Cultural Organization. He was also a member of the Majlis, the Iranian Parliament, and one-time Governor of the Iranian province of Fars.

Prior to his present position, Dr. Fatemi was Professor of Oriental Culture and History at Princeton University. Dr. Fatemi is author of several books on the Middle East, amongst his titles are "A Diplomatic History of Persia" and "Oil Diplomacy: "Powderkeg in Iran." He also was the publisher of a literary magazine and a daily newspaper in his native Iran.

13 RAMAZ STUDENTS WIN REGENT STATE SCHOLARSHIPS School Attains Highest Percentage In State

Of the 21 students in the current graduating class of Ramaz School who took the Regent State Scholarship examinations last January, 13 won scholarship awards. This is 62% of the group and represents the highest percentage of winners in the entire State. 30,000 students participated in the competitive examination.

Two students, Aviva Cantor and Bruce Shoulson won, in addition, the Cornell University Scholarships. David Greenseid also won a State Engineering Scholarship. Numerous other honors were achieved by the students of the class, and these will be announced in forthcoming issues of the Bulletin.

to those whose scholarship and perseverance were thus rewarded. Our congratulations are also warmly expressed to the proud parents of these students.

It is interesting to note that 88 students from the Jewish Day Schools of the State are on the list of winners. Relative to the number of Day School students who took the examination, this figure is probably unprecedented. It is of special interest to record the fact that the highest grade in the competitive examination was obtained by a student of a Jewish Day School. Indeed, of the three highest grades in the State, two were obtained by Jewish Day School students.
