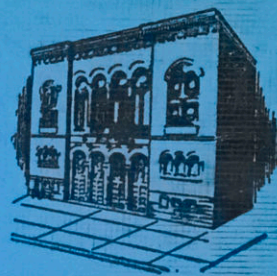

RABBI LOOKSTEIN ON TV THIS SUNDAY

This coming Sunday morning, May 19th, Rabbi Lookstein will appear on the TV program "Look Up and Live" which will be shown on CBS Channel 2 from 10:30 to 11 o'clock.

This program will be devoted to a portrayal of Orthodox Judaism in action and many well known professional actors will participate in it. It will be the third in a series on "The Workshop of Jews in America." Those who viewed the Rabbi on TV on previous occasions know that we have a real treat coming up for us this Sunday morning at 10:30.

SHERWOOD PLITNICK APPOINTED CANTOR

Max J. Etra, president of the congregation, announced on behalf of the Board of Trustees that Mr. Sherwood Plitnick has been appointed as our new cantor. Mr. Plitnick's appointment goes into effect immediately and he will officiate regularly at services beginning this Saturday.

A young man of charm and talent Cantor Plitnick comes to us with a fine background in learning as well as in music. He is a graduate of the Mesifita Chaim Berlin and he holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Brooklyn College. Advanced Jewish studies earned him a Bachelor of Hebrew Literature from the Jewish Theological Seminary.

Cantor Plitnick has studied with many outstanding vocal and music teachers and he is a graduate of the Cantors Conservatory of America which was founded by the renowned Cantors Weiser and Lipitz.

Prior to coming here Mr. Plitnick served for four years as cantor of the Inwood Hebrew Congregation. He has appeared both on radio and television. For two years he sang weekly on the

All the names that appear must be submitted to the office. No name is recorded on the strength of a previous listing.

Those who have not as yet taken care of this matter are asked to do so without delay. The Book of Remembrance is consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pledge for charity is made. In order to eliminate all aspects of commercialism contributions are limited to not less than \$5 nor more than \$10 per name.
