RABBI LOOKSTEIN'S TV PROGRAM BRINGS CRITICAL ACCLAIM

Last week when we informed our readers that Rabbi Lookstein was to appear on TV this past Sunday morning we predicted a real treat. What we anticipated seems mild in comparison to the unprecedented review of this program which was printed in the May 20th edition of the New York Times. Here is what TV Critic Jack Gould had to say:

"'Look up and Live', the Columbia Broadcasting System's religious program, was responsible yesterday morning for a half-hour of informative and moving television. The program was an explanation of Orthodox Judaism and how members of that faith worship in their homes and in the synagogue.

With Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun in New York serving as guide, the program detailed the prayers recited by Orthodox Jews at various times during the day, the dietary customs, the rabbinical laws, the observance of the Sabbath and the ritual in the synagogue.

The presentation employed the technique of a live documentary. The cameras with quiet simplicity, showed members of a family gathering for prebreakfast prayers in their home and then, as might happen in any other American family, discussing the national pastime of baseball.
