SHEVUOTH IN THE SYNAGOGUE

Shevuoth, the Feast of Weeks, commemorates the giving of the Ten Commandments on Mt. Sinai. It is also known as Chag Habikkurim, the Festival of First Fruits — a joyous occasion in ancient Palestine, an even more joyous occasion in the new State of Israel.

On Wednesday morning, June 5, the first day of Shevuoth, the scriptural reading will include the Ten Commandments. This will be preceded by the chanting of Akdomos by the Rabbi and the congregation.

On Thursday, June 6, the second day of the festival, the Book of Ruth will be read, and Yizkor services recited. The Book of Remembrance, which the Congregation publishes annually, and in which are recorded the names of these in whose memory a Yizkor offering was made, will be made available to our worshippers at these Memorial services.

Shevuoth is the last major festival of the year — the third of the Shalosh Regalim. As the Festival of the Torah, it bids us to re-dedicate ourselves to the teachings and traditions of our faith. By our presence in the synagogue on the holiday, we affirm our loyalty to the Torah.

TO ALL WORSHIPPERS

In keeping with our policy, we have omitted from the Schedule of Shevuoth Services the time when the Memorial Service (Yizkor) will be recited. We consider Yizkor a part of the entire morning's service, and those who wish to offer memorial prayers with us, are requested to be in the Synagogue when the morning service begins—at 9:00 o'clock—and to remain until the services are concluded, no later than 12:00 noon.

Continuing a policy established two years ago our Sisterhood and Men's Club are again joining hands to sponsor a Parents Day Sabbath. This special Sabbath will take place on Saturday, June 15th.

An unusual feature of that day will be the graduation exercises of the Afternoon Religious School. All the children of the Religious School will participate in the services and will join the graduating students as guests of honor.

Following a pattern well known to our worshippers, the congregation at the close of services, will remove to the auditorium of the Synagogue House where the graduating exercises will take place. An interesting program has been arranged that will include the awarding of diplomas to those students who have completed the entire course of study in our Religious School. The students who will receive diplomas are Jonathan D. Bien, Michael E. Pearson, Alan N. Shapiro, Katherine Silverblatt, Sidney F. Wolitzky and Rachel Zelkind.

At the conclusion of the service a tasty buffet kiddush will be served in the Social Hall by the Sisterhood and Men's Club in honor of the graduating class and the students of the school.

The Sabbath service is scheduled to begin at 9 o'clock. For the younger students we have made special arrangements. They will meet in the chapel at 10:30 where a special service will be conducted on their level. At approximately 11:30 they will be taken to the main synagogue to join in the musaf service.

We extend a cordial invitation to all members and friends of the Sisterhood and Men's Club and especially to the parents of the Religious School children to join us in this celebration of Parents Day Sabbath.
