Dr. Bernard Lander To Discuss Religious Revival At Men's Club Open Forum

The first Men's Club Open Forum meeting of the year which will be held on Tuesday, December 3, 1957, at 8:30 P.M. in the Social Hall of the Synagogue has been announced by Dr.

ISIDOR ETRA OF BLESSED MEMORY

The entire Kehilath Jeshurun family is bowed with grief at the untimely passing of Isidor Etra, one of the most beloved members of the Congregation, and the dear brother of our President, and of Louis and Harry Etra.

"Izzy" as he was affectionately known to us all, was affiliated with Kehilath Jeshurun for nearly twentyfive years. He brought honor and prestige to Kehilath Jeshurun, by the high reputation that he enjoyed in the community. He was a founder of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, a recognized leader in the United Jewish Appeal, and a generous contributor to Federation. Several years ago he founded the Jewish Center at Atlantic Beach, which has since become one of the leading suburban congregations of the Metropolitan area. His memory will long abide in affection and in reverence in the hearts of our member-

Dr. Lander is the Visiting Director of Graduate Division of Yeshiva University, and is responsible for the direction and expansion of the graduate studies at the University.

A one-time practicing rabbi who turned sociologist, Dr. Lander was ordained by the Yeshiva University's Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, and served as spiritual leader of Beth Congregation in Baltimore, Maryland from 1939 to 1944, when he was named a consultant to the State Commission on Juvenile Delinquency and a member of the Baltimore Youth Commission.

He is Author of "Towards an Understanding of Juvenile Delinquency," pulished by Columbia University Press, and has contributed to numerous scholarly publications. Active in many civic and communal organizations, he is chairman of the Social Action Committee of the Synagogue Council of America, Chairman of the Overseas Commission of Rabbinical Council of America, a member of the Executive Boards of the Mizrachi Organization of America and a trustee of Bar-Ilan University in Israel.

The subject of Dr. Lander's address has been a subject of considerable discussion in recent years. His presentation is sure to provoke much spirited discussion.
