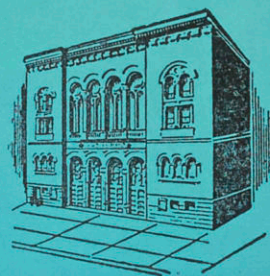

NOTES ON THE COMING HOLIDAY SEASON

With the approaching holiday season the New York Board of Rabbis has expressed its concern for Jewish students attending public schools being brought in contact with holiday celebrations. In accordance with the Statement of Principles on Religious Holiday Observances in Public Schools of the Joint Advisory Committee of the Synagogue Council of America and the National Community Relations Advisory Council, The New York Board of Rabbis is attempting to determine the extent and scope of such celebrations in the public schools. The Board is especially interested in obtaining the following information:

1: Is the Nativity play or pageant

being planned or arranged for the celebration of Christmas?

2: Is the erection or installation of a creche, that is the manger scene being planned?

3: Does the program for the forthcoming celebration of Christmas include the singing of Christological Hymns (such hymns as "Holy Night," but not "Jingle Bells")?

4: Is the "Lord's Prayer" being recited in assembly or classroom exercises?

5: What Chanukah observances take place. Candle lighting ceremony, Chanukah plays, Chanukah songs?
