Mr. Max J. Etra, president of the congregation, has announced the launching of the 1958 Year Book Campaign.

Our devoted member, Mr. Al Feiner, in advance of the formal campaign has already, although unsolicited, procured nearly \$1,500 in advertisements. Our esteemed member, Mr. Richard Kolb, has also set an example for the entire congregation and has up to this time accounted for about \$500 in advertisements. These gentlemen have set a pattern which is worthy of emulation by the entire membership.

As in past years, the sole beneficiary of Year Book proceeds is the Educational Scholarship Fund. Not one penny of the income derived goes to the Congregation itself. The Educational Scholarship Fund has been set up to provide scholarships for deserving children attending the: Ramaz School and the Afternoon Religious School. Allocations are also made for summer camp and college scholarships.

The Year Book Campaign is, therefore, certainly a worthy one and merits the support of all. The children who are assisted by us come from the entire metropolitan New York area so the obligation is not strictly a local one. The Year Book campaign is one activity in which everyone can parti-

The questionnaires are being returned, unsigned, to Mrs. Levine and should offer an accurate picture of the attitudes of the membership toward integration.

A fascinating part of the meeting will be devoted to a discussion of what these questionnaires reveal about the real feelings harbored towards issues which are read about and talked about—but seldom in personal terms.

Mrs. Levine is especially qualified to speak on this topic. She has been with the American Jewish Congress for the past eight years in many capacities. She joined the Congress staff as a member of the Commission on Law and Social Action. She subsequently became Program Assistant and then National Director of the Women's Division.

Prior to her work with the American Jewish Congress, Mrs. Levine practiced law in New York City. She received her undergraduate education at Hunter College and her Law Degree from Columbia University. She was an editor of the Columbia Law Review.
